Narrative

1. On November 16, 2022, at approximately 3:16 PM, Idaho State Police Investigations Lieutenant Catlin and I, interviewed [REDACTED]. The interview took place at his parent's house, located at [REDACTED] in Boise, Ada County, Idaho. During the interview, [REDACTED] stated the following:
2. His residence at school was [REDACTED], Moscow, Idaho. His residence is approximately 200-300 feet from the location of the homicide. It had been a little nerve wracking going outside of his apartment.
3. He knew some of the homicide victims. He knew Maddi (Madison MOGEN), and Xana (Xana KERNODLE). He had met Kaylee (Kaylee GONCALVES) the night before the homicide but did not realize she was one of the victims until later. He did not know the male victim (Ethan CHAPIN).
4. At this point in the interview [REDACTED] mother [REDACTED] arrived home and was present for the remainder of the interview.
5. He had known MOGEN since their freshman year and they were in the same pledge class for the fraternities and sororities on campus. MOGEN had dated some of [REDACTED] friends and had positive interactions with [REDACTED] girlfriend in the past. [REDACTED] had classes with MOGEN, and they had done homework together periodically. He and MOGEN had a lot of friends in common as well. He supposed he had met GONCALVES prior to that night but did not recall specifically.
6. He had never met KERNODLE's boyfriend (Ethan CHAPIN) before. [REDACTED] heard CHAPIN belonged to the [REDACTED] fraternity. CHAPIN was also a year younger than [REDACTED] in school.
7. MOGEN was dating one of [REDACTED] fraternity brothers, [REDACTED] whom [REDACTED] believed lived in Boise. [REDACTED] had spoken to [REDACTED] earlier in the day on November 16th. [REDACTED] is a stand-up guy. MOGEN's previous boyfriend was also one of [REDACTED] friends and is also a nice guy, he and MOGEN were mostly just on and off [REDACTED] friends.
8. Saturday night (November 12th) and into Sunday morning (November 13th), at the end of the game day, people went out to the bars. [REDACTED] ran into MOGEN at the Corner Club. MOGEN and GONCALVES were going to leave the bar to go to John's Alley, and asked [REDACTED] if he wanted to go with them. On the way to John's Alley MOGEN and GONCALVES decided to get food at the Grub Truck instead.
9. [REDACTED] was at the Grub Truck with them but was hanging out in the back because he was not getting any food. Someone in a silver sedan picked up MOGEN and GONCALVES. He assumed it was one of their friends. [REDACTED] told MOGEN to have a good night. [REDACTED] designated driver's shift had already ended at approximately 2:00 AM. [REDACTED] had a good coat on, so he walked home. He thought it took him 20-30 minutes to walk home from the Grub Truck. [REDACTED] got home around 3:00 AM and went to bed. [REDACTED] showed on a map the way he walked home, and the way he described did not pass the residence of the homicide scene.
10. Sunday, November 13th, [REDACTED] woke up around 10:00 AM to watch NFL football. He left his house and went to "Floyd's", a dispensary across the border in Washington. He couldn't remember if he went to Floyd's before he started watching football, or if he started watching football, then went to Floyd's. He thought it was weird because he drove past the scene on his way to Floyd's and didn't see any police or anything out of the ordinary. [REDACTED] drove a [REDACTED]
11. During the morning people called him to see if he knew what was going on down the street at the homicide scene. [REDACTED] didn't believe them and walked outside to see. [REDACTED] had to walk down the street to see the residence/homicide scene. There was a rumor of an unconscious person, which seemed believable.
12. During the group chat between the pledge classes from the fraternities and sororities, kids realized people were missing, and something more than a person passed out might have happened. Most of his chats are via Snapchat. Some of the family members of the victims started letting people know about the homicide before the news did.

13. [REDACTED] heard a lot of people were packing up and leaving. [REDACTED] felt jumpy even leaving his apartment and walking out to his car. He would be able to do his classes online, so he packed up the next morning (Monday, November 14th) and left.
14. He had only been to the residence where the homicide took place, maybe once. When he did go there, he was pretty sure it was all different people living there. He heard there was a party there earlier that day, that some of his friends went to.
15. [REDACTED] went to the Corner Club by himself because he had friends who went there and worked there. [REDACTED] MOGEN, and GONCALVES were the only ones in their group who left the Corner Club and went to the Grub Truck. Of the victims, only MOGEN and GONCALVES were out at the bar. [REDACTED] believed KERNODLE and CHAPIN were still underage.
16. [REDACTED] thought the car in front of their house looked similar to the one who picked them up that night. It seemed like a friend that picked them up, not a random person. People usually use designated drivers from their fraternities/sororities. He thought maybe KERNODLE and CHAPIN might have picked MOGEN and GONCALVES up.
17. [REDACTED] doesn't usually go to parties; he usually goes to the bar. He heard a rumor there was a party at the victim's residence earlier. KERNODLE sometimes would get a little crazy with partying and [REDACTED]. MOGEN just uses alcohol. GONCALVES, he thought just drank alcohol only. He doesn't remember meeting GONCALVES prior to that night.
18. After the incident he heard rumors of GONCALVES having a stalker. Any girl who belonged to the [REDACTED] sorority should know about the stalker information. MOGEN and GONCALVES, he believed, both belonged to the [REDACTED] sorority.
19. [REDACTED] had an ex-girlfriend he was trying to get back together with. For most of the past few years, he had a girlfriend who went to a different school, so he hadn't been hanging out with a lot of people regularly.
20. [REDACTED] had no idea who could have committed these homicides. Usually, the craziest thing that happens are people getting MIPs and DUIs.
21. He hadn't heard any rumors about why this could have happened. He thought the only reason someone might have acted out like this is for love.
22. He heard there are videos of him at the Grub Truck with MOGEN and GONCALVES. The Grub Truck live streams video on Twitch TV. News outlets have identified him from that video and have called him.
23. [REDACTED] left Moscow Monday morning around noon. He travelled home by way of Ontario, Oregon instead of New Meadows, because he doesn't like driving through the mountains.
24. With consent, I collected buccal swabs from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] had no apparent injuries to his hands, forearms, head or neck areas.
25. The interview ended at approximately 4:02 PM. For complete details review audio recording of interview.
26. The buccal swabs and the audio recording of the interview were submitted into evidence under Tag# 220004140, as item 1 and item 2, respectively.

Summary Narrative

On November 17, 2022, Idaho State Police Detective Victoria M. Gooch and Moscow Police Department Sergeant Dustin Blaker interviewed [REDACTED] at her residence, [REDACTED] Boise, Ada County, Idaho, 83712. The interview occurred with [REDACTED] attorney present via computer (audio/video), [REDACTED] an attorney in Moscow, Latah County, Idaho.

The interview was also audio recorded by me and Sgt. Blaker. The thumb drive of the interview was assigned Tag #220004172 (01) in the Tiburon Case Management System on November 20, 2022. The audio file of the interview had been downloaded onto the thumb drive on November 18, 2022, and the thumb drive was maintained in my sole care and custody until entered into evidence on November 20, 2022.

Narrative

1. On November 17, 2022, at approximately 12:05 p.m., myself, Idaho State Police Detective Victoria M. Gooch, and Moscow Police Department Sergeant Dustin Blaker interviewed [REDACTED] at her residence, [REDACTED] Boise, Ada County, Idaho, 83712. The interview occurred with [REDACTED] attorney present via computer (audio/video), [REDACTED] an attorney in Moscow, Latah County, Idaho with the law firm Sullivan Law Offices.

2. The interview was also audio recorded by me and Sgt. Blaker. The thumb drive of the interview was assigned Tag #220004172 (01) in the Tiburon Case Management System on November 20, 2022. The audio file of the

interview had been downloaded onto the thumb drive on November 18, 2022, and the thumb drive was maintained in my sole care and custody until entered into evidence on November 20, 2022.

3. [REDACTED] stated the following:

4. She is a sophomore at the University of Idaho studying pre-Physical Therapy. She has been a University of Idaho student for both years (freshman and this year).

5. She had been residing at the residence where this incident occurred since August 2022.

6. Her friend [REDACTED] and she moved into the residence and the other female roommates she knew through their sorority [REDACTED] Maddie and Xana prior to this year, and had also met Kaylee before, but Kaylee belonged to another sorority. She explained Kaylee was a senior in school.

7. She described Xana as being a year older than herself.

8. She also described two additional friends, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], but they were not residents in the house. [REDACTED] explained [REDACTED] introduced her to Xana last year. Both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] reside in [REDACTED] apartments (an apartment complex on campus that houses sorority members).

9. She described the layout of their residence, and where each of the roommates resided (paraphrased based on [REDACTED] description of their residence, "when you walk in, there is a door, there is downstairs with a bathroom and [REDACTED] bedroom; when you walk into the door, there is a hallway with her bedroom and the kitchen and the sliding door, and upstairs is Kaylee's room and a bathroom and Maddie's room; Xana is on the same floor as her bedroom").

10. Initially, she was asked to describe what the girls did on the 12th of November, but she described there was a ball on Friday night, November 11, 2022, a Pi [REDACTED] Sorority ball, which she briefly attended. She explained she started drinking at 4:30 p.m. on the 11th.

11. She described the individuals at the ball, including all her roommates, as well as Ethan and his [REDACTED] and their dates who were FIJI Fraternity members, [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] date [REDACTED].

12. Kaylee (Goncalves) was [REDACTED] date for the ball.

13. [REDACTED] described how she got home on Friday night, by using an Uber from the Pi [REDACTED] ball to their residence. She explained she and her roommates normally have [REDACTED] as their Uber driver, but not on the night of the 11th. She does not remember the name of the Uber driver on Friday night. This was around 8:30 p.m. She explained she and the roommates trust [REDACTED].

14. She advised the party initially transitioned to the [REDACTED], but she got bored and wanted to go home. It was she, Maddie and Xana, and Ethan regarding the roommates who attended the ball.

15. Eventually a group from the [REDACTED] Pi event transitioned to [REDACTED] and the other roommate's house, and there was a party that continued there until the early morning hours of November 12th (Saturday). She requested to look at her cell phone during this point in the interview to verify the time line. She was advised she could use her cell phone to provide times during her interview.

16. She advised the other individuals that came to the house on Friday night were [REDACTED], initially she said it was [REDACTED] but corrected herself to say it was not [REDACTED] but [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who came to the house, and [REDACTED] as well as herself. They were consuming large amounts of alcohol and playing music. She went to bed a little after 12:10 a.m., and then added she went to bed sometime between 12:10 a.m. and 12:30 a.m. that morning (November 12th).

17. Eventually she advised Maddie (Mogen) came home, and eventually Kaylee (Goncalves), but she was not certain about where Kaylee was when she went to bed.

18. She then explained on Saturday morning (November 12th), at approximately 12:15 p.m. (she then corrected the time to 11:44 a.m.), the roommates went together to get coffee and the store to get more alcohol. They still

had champagne from the previous weekend, which was she explained was the U of I parent's weekend.

19. She explained the plans for that Saturday night included a [REDACTED] Kai fraternity party on campus. [REDACTED] explained Kaylee was not going to this function, because she was a senior and typically seniors do not attend the Fraternity functions on campus because they are old enough to go to the local clubs. [REDACTED] explained she was going to the [REDACTED] Kai party. [REDACTED] further explained at one point Maddie was at this function but left the function to go to the club with Kaylee.

20. They were all at the house together at 5 p.m. on Saturday (November 12th). [REDACTED] stated Kaylee decided to go and take a nap, and [REDACTED] Maddie, Xana, [REDACTED] and she were on the couch watching a movie.

21. [REDACTED] explained they all were together Saturday afternoon at the house, and they all decided to take naps and each of the girls set their alarms for 8 p.m. [REDACTED] believes Ethan may have come over to the house at this time but she was not certain if this is the time Ethan came over, or if he showed up at a different time.

22. [REDACTED] explained she had an assignment due in her Psychology 215 course, so she posted the assignment at approximately 10:12 p.m. She believes she then left the house at approximately 10:30 p.m. (Saturday night).

23. When [REDACTED] left the house, Kaylee was still there with one of her friends, however, [REDACTED] does not know the friend's name. She described the friend was female and was nice.

24. After leaving the house, she saw Maddie between their residence and the [REDACTED], and Maddie was holding a box of White Claws while she was walking towards their house. She advised she talked to Maddie and then [REDACTED] continued to the [REDACTED] Kai function. She believed Maddie was going back to their residence to get ready to go to the club with Kaylee. (Sgt. Blaker asked [REDACTED] to give more details about the route she took when she encountered Maddie and she provided those details in this interview).

25. She explained when she got to the [REDACTED] Kai function, she wanted to meet up with Xana and [REDACTED] and she called Xana on her cell phone to find out which apartment they were in, and she was told they were in Apartment [REDACTED]. Others who were at Apartment [REDACTED] at this time were Ethan, [REDACTED] Xana, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] explained she and [REDACTED] were going in and out of the fraternity lodge together for part of the night. [REDACTED] explained there were not a lot of people at this function.

26. She further explained after she met up with [REDACTED] and the two of them then went to [REDACTED] apartment.

27. She was with Ethan (Chapin) and Xana during part of the night, and [REDACTED] explained Ethan had been trying to get in contact with his sister [REDACTED] because she had been upset about something and he was worried about her, but [REDACTED] did not know what the issue was. She remembered [REDACTED] told her brother she had not been answering her cell phone because she had been sleeping.

28. She described Ethan as being very protective of his sister as well as protective with all of the roommates.

29. The group of them then went to visit [REDACTED] who she had previously met through Xana, and [REDACTED] was also there, including she, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were also there, as well as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] [REDACTED]).

30. When asked how much alcohol she had consumed, she explained she had been playing "Rage Cage," which she described was a drinking game, and when she awakened from her nap, she consumed three White Claws (with an alcoholic content of 5%). She denied there was any drug use, and stated Xana and Ethan used [REDACTED]. She advised neither Maddie or Kaylee did drugs. She explained she nor [REDACTED] "never touched that stuff".

31. She described the alcohol used at [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] residence, which included [REDACTED] consuming a whole "borg", in which she also consumed some of the "borg" (Based on a Google search I conducted relative to writing this report, a Borg is an alcoholic beverage which requires taking an empty gallon container and filling it halfway with water, adding vodka and enough MiO to make the taste of vodka disappear. The cocktail is often referred to as a borg, but the nickname doubles as an acronym that stands for the drink's full name: black-out rage gallon).

32. She described [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) as being extremely intoxicated, and that she had continued to

consume alcohol and because of [REDACTED] intoxicated condition. [REDACTED] advised she invited [REDACTED] to come back to her residence with her to watch movies, and because of [REDACTED] intoxicated condition, she called a Sobro, which she described is a involving a sober Freshman fraternity member who is a designated driver for fraternity and sorority members who are consuming alcohol, to drive them to their homes safely.

33. She advised it was only she and [REDACTED] that went back to the residence, using the Sobro. She did not believe anyone else was home.

34. When the two of them got home, which she believed was sometime between 1:15 a.m. and 1:30 a.m. (November 13th), she was intoxicated and because of that, she does not remember what time it actually was, but she beleived it was between the two times mentioned.

35. She further advised she made popcorn in the kitchen and she and [REDACTED] watched "Vampire Diaries" together.

36. Approximately twenty minutes later, [REDACTED] returned home. The three of them layed down and continued to watch Vampire Diaries. She believes [REDACTED] may have walked home, and then she advised she does not know what time [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went to bed. She had already gone to bed and does not know when [REDACTED] may have left or when [REDACTED] went to bed.

37. At approximately 2:00 or 2:30 a.m., she awakened because Maddie and Kaylee arrived home with Grub Truck food, and they had Mac and Cheese, which [REDACTED] explained they normally got. All four of them were together, which included [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Maddie and Kaylee. [REDACTED] advised they were taking selfie videos. All the girls talked about getting Grub Truck food. She did not believe Xana and Ethan were home because their bedroom door was open and she did not see them, and she discussed whether she may have been mistaken about this fact, and then she said she was certain she saw their door was open and they were not home.

38. She then went to bed, which she advised was after texting [REDACTED] the Uber driver.

39. [REDACTED] looked at her phone to determine what time she had texted [REDACTED] the Uber driver, and said her phone said 3:10 a.m., but after further discussion, [REDACTED] admitted she was some confused about whether she was using Moscow time or Boise time, and [REDACTED] explained her time line may be off by an hour because of this issue (specifically during this interview referencing Boise time instead of providing the time it would have been in Moscow when these events were occurring on the 13th of November).

40. She explained she uses Snap Chat as well as her cell phone to communicate with her friends. She advised if there is lack of texted communications on her cell phone, it is because she had transitioned to using the Snap Chat app for her method of communication. She advised her log in information with Snap Chat is [REDACTED], and her password is either [REDACTED]. She denied knowing her roommate's passwords to their cell phones.

41. While they were together, they talked about ordering Grub Truck and she then texted [REDACTED] the Uber driver, at approximately 3:10 a.m. She explained she texted to [REDACTED] "Are you driving by chance?".

42. At approximately 3:13 a.m., [REDACTED] texted her back. She then went to bed. She does not believe [REDACTED] ever came to their house because she never responded to his text about the fact that he was still driving.

43. She advised [REDACTED] the Uber driver, is in his 30's, is married and has one child. She advised all of the girls knew him and liked him.

44. [REDACTED] advised she is not certain if she stayed awake to watch more Vampire Diaries episodes, or if she went to sleep. She was not certain if she locked her bedroom door, and she was not certain if she locked the sliding door, because she was the one who usually did, but she also volunteered in her statement that she believed Moscow was a safe place so the sliding door was not always locked.

45. She does not remember if anyone locked the sliding glass door before she went to bed. She was the first to go to bed ahead of the other roommates.

46. She explained that she previously has had a lot of dreams where she had been kidnapped in her dreams, and

she further explained these types of dreams started in high school, and she knew they were dreams and she would let those things happen in her dreams because she realized they were dreams. She advised she does not suffer from anxiety and denied prior life trauma other than divorced parents.

47. [REDACTED] explained she was awakened to a noise sometime between 4:00 a.m. and 4:20 a.m.

48. She was asked to explain the amount of alcohol she had consumed before going to bed, and she again explained while she was playing Rage Cage, which included the White Claws, part of [REDACTED] Borg, and maybe two or three more drinks (White Claws) at [REDACTED] house. She denied drinking after she left [REDACTED] house. She advised she had been consuming the alcohol until approximately 1:15 to 1:30 a.m. on Sunday morning. She denied drinking anymore alcohol after she and [REDACTED] got back to her residence.

49. At 4:22 a.m. (she confirmed this information by looking at the texted communication on a cell phone), she texted Kaylee asking her "what's going on?" She advised her phone said 5:22 a.m., which she advised would have been 4:22 a.m. Moscow time.

50. She advised around 4:00 a.m. or 4:20 a.m., she heard Kaylee singing and playing music. She heard who she believed Kaylee walking up the stairs and [REDACTED] advised she heard Kaylee say "someone's here," and she sounded frantic. [REDACTED] described Kaylee's tone as somewhere between talking and yelling it. She believed it was Kaylee who was walking up the stairs with Murphy.

51. She said she heard who she believed to be Kaylee running down the stairs. She advised Murphy was barking at this time.

52. [REDACTED] advised she has been [REDACTED]
[REDACTED]
[REDACTED]

53. She does not believe Murphy is normally a barker.

54. She further stated she believed it was Kaylee who was running down the stairs after she heard her say "someone is here". She further explained she does not know if she actually heard this, or whether she was drunk and did not actually hear any of this. She heard the footsteps of who she believed to be Kaylee. She explained all the girls wear Doc Martens and that is what she believed she was hearing Kaylee coming down the stairs wearing her Doc Martens because of the sound of the footsteps coming down the stairs.

55. [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] at 4:19 a.m. Then Xana at 4:20 a.m., Kaylee at 4:20 a.m., and then [REDACTED] again at 4:20 a.m. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] told her about seeing fireworks. She texted [REDACTED] a last time at 4:27 a.m. before she went to [REDACTED] room.

56. [REDACTED] then explained when she first opened her door, and she said she did not see anyone.

57. The second time when she opened her door, she heard who she believed to be Kaylee crying and [REDACTED] believed Kaylee was in the second floor bathroom. She then heard a male voice, which she stated she had never heard before, say "It's okay, I'm going to help you". [REDACTED] believed the unidentified male was in the bathroom and with the person who was crying. She believes it was Kaylee who was the one crying. [REDACTED] stated that now she has gathered additional information, she now believes it was probably Xana who was crying. At the moment of hearing the crying, she stated she believed it was Kaylee who was crying. She advised she knows the male's voice was not Ethan's voice.

58. She described the last episode of Vampire Diaries and she remembered it was two males rescuing a female. She explained it was not violent. She advised the male figure in the last episode was wearing all black, but [REDACTED] explained that was normal for the series.

59. She is not certain whether she heard Murphy barking during the first time she opened her door, but she advised it was possible he was barking but Murphy was moving away from the house. She described Murphy was a puppy and [REDACTED] had just met him in August. She could not describe Murphy as being skiddish.

60. She advised she opened and closed her door a total of three times, and the fourth time is when she left her

bedroom to go downstairs to [REDACTED] bedroom.

61. [REDACTED] advised she continued to call and text her roommates but received no answers. She provided the times she called and texted her roommates, and the time span she advised would have been between 4:20 a.m. to 4:27 a.m. She advised she never thought about an intruder, and in her mind, she stated she was not processing what was occurring as threatening.

62. She advised she believed the male was directing his conversation of who she believed was Kaylee. She advised she did not believe the male was directing that statement to her.

63. In discussing why the offender did not harm her, it was discussed that it was possible the male knew her and wanted to protect her, and she said she understood that was possible, but she denied knowing who the suspect was.

64. [REDACTED] further explained she Snap Chatted Ethan but received no answer from Ethan. [REDACTED] thought Ethan was still either at [REDACTED] Kai or was at home, she was not certain.

65. The third time [REDACTED] opened her door, she said her vision was blurry, or fuzzy, but she advised she saw a figure of someone that was dressed in all black, and they were masked and he was holding an item of what she initially perceived was a vacuum, but she said that did not make sense to her. She described the suspect as not being muscular, but being skinny and toned, like a basketball player. She further described him as being taller than her 5'10" frame by at least 3", so he would have been 6' in height. She advised he had to have heard her call Kaylee and Xana and she thought he would have had to have heard her calling for them and she was confused as to why he did not come to her room.

66. She described the item the suspect was holding, which she advised was like a cylinder, and she remembered a "cop" talking about a bow, so she was trying to ascertain if what she saw was in fact shaped like a bow. [REDACTED] further stated she thought that maybe it was a firefighter because of what [REDACTED] told her about seeing a firecracker. She advised he would have been approximately 3' away from her and she believed she saw him walking out the back, sliding-glass door. He he had looked at her before walking out the back door. She was not certain if he could see her whole body or just her head.

67. At 4:22 a.m., then [REDACTED] corrected her time and stated at 4:23 a.m., she advised she texted [REDACTED] and they conversed about someone wearing all black, and [REDACTED] said something to the effect of "What the fuck, why is Xana wearing all black". [REDACTED] explained she was not certain if she had been dreaming this or if it was real.

68. [REDACTED] explained she saw the suspect holding something she believed to be cylinder shaped and also shaped like a triangle at the bottom of the cylinder shape. She advised the suspect was approximately 3' away from her and he looked at her but was walking out the sliding door when she saw him. She said she saw his eyebrows.

69. At approximately 4:23 a.m., she texted [REDACTED] to tell her she saw a masked suspect in their house.

70. [REDACTED] responded at approximately 4:25 a.m. telling her to come to her [REDACTED] bedroom and that "it's better than being alone." [REDACTED] then left her bedroom after opening her door the fourth time and ran to [REDACTED] bedroom downstairs.

71. [REDACTED] advised when she left her bedroom, she looked down the hallway to Xana's bedroom and could see Xana lying on her back in her underwear, but she thought at the time Xana was passed out. [REDACTED] stated she never went into Xana's bedroom, and she could only see Xana from the hallway as she was running to get to [REDACTED] bedroom. She advised she was too scared to go into Xana's room, and she knew [REDACTED] was awake, and she knew to go there because she was scared. She saw Xana was wearing her underwear, and she explained Xana was comfortable enough with the roommates that she would wear her underwear around them, so this was not unusual.

72. When asked about the lighting conditions inside the residence, she advised that possibly Xana's light was on, or the party lights were on and that is how she was able to see Xana because otherwise she would not have been able to see her lying on the floor without any lights being on. She was not certain if the bathroom lights were on but she was not certain what lights were on if any. She advised Xana did not say anything. [REDACTED] stated she did

not think anything was wrong. She later offered she may have been able to see Xana lying on the floor because they also had a Scentsy light and it could have been she was able to see Xana from the Scentsy light.

73. She explained she has been trying to determine what was real from everything that she had been talking about with Sgt. Blaker and myself. She advised she knew the time with [REDACTED] Kaylee, and Maddie were real because she has the video of them together. She was not certain how [REDACTED] got home that day).

74. She further explained she has been trying to piece things together because some things do not make sense to her.

75. She stated that she is being truthful, but some of what she has been discussing, she is not certain is factual. She has been working through it to try to remember what happened.

76. [REDACTED] was asked if the female who was crying was saying anything, and she advised no, the female was only crying and the male was the only one talking.

77. She described the item the suspect was holding was cylinder-shaped, and was also triangular-shaped. She could not remember if the lights were on or off when she encountered the male suspect. She advised she does not know if this is even something she saw or it was something she dreamed.

78. She advised the last time she saw Xana was at [REDACTED] house at approximately 11:04 p.m. [REDACTED] confirmed this by checking her cell phone). Xana had been holding a White Claw. She was at [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] at 12:49 a.m.

79. She further advised Xana and Ethan did not stay at Ethan's house with any frequency. Because of Ethan's grades, he could not reside at the fraternity. He had his own apartment, but she does not know where his apartment is because she had never been there.

80. She knows Kaylee and Maddie were home when she went to bed, and [REDACTED] and from when she saw Xana lying on the floor, but she was not certain about whether Ethan was home.

81. She advised she left [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] house at approximately 12:49 a.m. to return home.

82. [REDACTED] stated she is certain at 3:11 a.m. (which through discussion might have been 2:11 a.m. Moscow time), [REDACTED] Kaylee, Maddie and she were all in the house. She was not certain about Xana and Ethan because she does not know when they came home.

83. She denied perceiving a threat, even after encountering the male in the hallway. She said there were people coming in and out of their house all the time. She denied remembering what his face looked like, and said she could see that his head and mouth were covered, but she could see his eyebrows, and further advised she was not certain she could see his nose. When asked if she knew what a balaclava was, and she said no, so I asked Sgt. Blaker to show [REDACTED] a picture of a balaclava from his cell phone, and upon looking at a picture of a balaclava, she said it "could have been, that could have been it." She does not remember seeing his mouth or nose, but she could see his eyebrows.

84. When asked if any of her roommates told her about prior incidents involving anything that concerned them, and she advised Kaylee had told them ([REDACTED] and the other roommates) about an incident a month prior when she was outside with Murphy about a subject who had been watching her. This subject was in the apartments above the girls' residence.

85. [REDACTED] further explained that two to three weeks ago, while at Winco, Kaylee told her about a male subject who followed her from the Winco store all the way to Kaylee's car, even when Kaylee went to leave, the subject was standing by Kaylee's car.

86. Also, two to three weeks ago, all of the roommates went to Starbuck's together and when they got home, their front door was wide-open, and they do not believe it had been open when they left. She explained there were prior issues with the front door, so she said it was possible the door opened because there had been a snow storm and she explained possibly the wind caused the door to open. Also, when they got home the washer was going, which she described was not unusual, but this also concerned her. She explained because of these things, they

went to get Ethan's golf clubs to protect themselves when they searched the house.

87. [REDACTED] explained weeks prior to the 13th, Kaylee told the roommates she heard a woman scream, but no one else heard it.

88. [REDACTED] was asked if she was telling either Sgt. Blaker or I anything to prevent us from solving this and she advised no, that she understood my question, and she advised that she knew she did not sleep through the whole incident because she has texted communications and other things that she knows would have required her to be awake. She advised she knows what she heard, especially about hearing who she believed was Kaylee crying and the male voice telling her he was there for her. She stated again she does not know how much of what she had been telling us was not factual because she is still processing the events.

89. When asked why she believes she was spared after the male suspect saw her, she said she does not know why, and she does not believe anyone ever tried to open her door during the time he was in the house, and he could have easily have done so, and why he would have passed by her room multiple times, she volunteered that to come through the sliding glass door, the person would have had to have scaled a tall wall. She advised the suspect would have known her room would have been occupied because he appeared to have known the layout of the house. She also said it could have been someone who was in the house last year when other girls were living in the house.

90. She advised there was no one she knows who would have wanted to hurt the girls, and the girls were loved by everyone. She said she had never heard even rumors which were negative about any of the victims.

91. When asked about Kaylee's ex-boyfriend, [REDACTED] advised the break-up was mutual and they have their dog Murphy in common, and [REDACTED] comes to their residence and plays with Murphy, and he and Kaylee continued to be friends. When asked if they "co-parented" Murphy, she said yes. Kaylee told her the relationship with [REDACTED] had run it's course. [REDACTED] thought [REDACTED] had handled the break-up well because everytime he came to their house, there did not seem to be an issue.

92. [REDACTED] brought up the name [REDACTED] but she mispronounced his last name during the interview, as someone she and the others believed might be involved, but she was reluctant to say he was a suspect because she knows how damaging to his reputation that could be if he were not involved. She advised she was told by [REDACTED], Xana's best friend, that [REDACTED] once punched a friend of theirs, [REDACTED] in the stomach last year, but [REDACTED] did not know the circumstances as to why.

93. [REDACTED] advised that recently Kaylee started talking to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] seemed okay with that.

94. [REDACTED] offered her DNA. (Sgt. Blaker secured a swab from [REDACTED] at the conclusion of the interview). She advised there might be difficult to locate the offender's DNA because they had conducted a deep clean of their residence leading up to the parent's weekend. When asked about when the deep clean of the residence occurred, it would have been before the weekend of the crimes.

95. She was advised there was evidence left in the residence and she sighed and said she was glad to hear that there was evidence found at the scene.

96. She explained her [REDACTED]

97. When asked if she would be able to provide a description to a police composite artist, she said she would not be able to describe enough of the suspect to be helpful. She further advised the only thing she remembered about his face was that his eyebrows were bushy.

98. She advised she was confused about why the offender would have taken the patio door out of the residence because of the drop off from the patio.

99. She advised she remembered that cars do come by their residence a lot, and she said there was a black truck driving past [REDACTED] window, and she further said she was not absolutely certain it was a black truck, but there was a vehicle that went by their residence and she could see the taillights but she did not remember if the headlights were on, but what drew her attention to it was the red lights on the back of the truck, and when asked if

she meant brake lights, she said yes.

100. When asked what occurred after she went into [REDACTED] bedroom, she said they eventually fell asleep, and when she awakened, she was lying next to [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] bed.

101. She advised a friend of theirs, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] mother are planning a memorial event and that has helped her emotionally. She advised [REDACTED] is crying a lot over this, but she has not been crying and [REDACTED] has explained to her why she has not been showing emotions.

102. She explained [REDACTED] used the word dissociate to describe her emotions.

103. When she awakened that morning, [REDACTED] was next to her in bed. They were both too scared to leave [REDACTED] room to even go to the bathroom.

104. She advised at approximately 11:23 a.m., [REDACTED] then corrected the time to 10:23 a.m. (Moscow time), [REDACTED] said she texted Maddie asking her if she was up.

105. At 11:29 a.m. (Moscow time), [REDACTED] texted Kaylee, "are you up?" She could tell her Snap Chats were not being read when she was texting them through Snap Chat.

106. [REDACTED] advised she called [REDACTED], one of her closest friends, about what happened that night with the masked man.

107. [REDACTED] then explained when she reached out to [REDACTED] in the text message, which [REDACTED] told her was at 10:50 a.m., but she thinks [REDACTED] was mistaken, [REDACTED] told her she would send [REDACTED] to their house because of their concerns about what had occurred during the night. When [REDACTED] got to the house, which she described was before Noon, she is not certain if he came in through an unlocked front door or had to use the code to the front door to get into the residence, and when he got into the house, he asked about the location of a knife, and she directed him to a knife.

108. She advised she initially went upstairs from [REDACTED] bedroom with [REDACTED] and she advised when she saw Xana, she realized Xana had not moved since she saw her earlier. She was still thinking Xana was still passed out from being drunk. [REDACTED] then sent [REDACTED] downstairs. She advised [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came over after [REDACTED] came to the house, because she had asked them to come to the house. She advised [REDACTED] then came downstairs and she could tell by his facial expression he had seen something, and he told them to call 911. [REDACTED] was the one to call 911, and [REDACTED] at one point said she was on the phone with Police Dispatch and the dispatcher was asking her about a defibrillator. They told Dispatch there were people unconscious. [REDACTED] denied seeing Xana or any of the other victim's bodies.

109. She advised they stayed in the house when the police arrived and they (the police) were putting the tape up, when they realized there had been a crime, and when they saw the ambulance arrive and leave, [REDACTED] told them they would not leave unless there was no reason to stay. She then advised the Vandal Alert came out, and that is when they realized their friends were actually gone.

110. She advised they all realized there had actually been a murder committed in their residence.

111. She said Kaylee had a balcony and she remembered looking at the pictures in the news, and Kaylee's curtains were all messed up. She thought the distance of the balcony to the ground may have been too much, and brought too much attention if that is how the suspect made entry into the house through Kaylee's bedroom.

112. When asked if she checked the house for anyone else when she initially came home for the night (with [REDACTED] and she was asked if she had to unlock the front door, and she advised she believes she had to unlock the front door to get into their residence. She advised when she first got home, she remembered the sliding door was closed, but she did not know if it was locked. She advised when she first got home, she went to Kaylee's bedroom to let Murphy out of Kaylee's room, and Kaylee's lights were on, and no one was in Kaylee's bedroom. Murphy came back into the house after going outside.

113. Sgt. Blaker asked [REDACTED] about the log-in and user name for the router of the WiFi at the residence, and [REDACTED] advised Kaylee was responsible for that bill. She further explained she nor [REDACTED] were responsible for

the WiFi bill because they had just moved into the residence in August.

114. [REDACTED] had some follow-up questions for [REDACTED] outside of the interview, and as a result, the audio recording was turned off at 2:11 p.m. this same date.

3. She lived in the room that [REDACTED] is currently in. Madison MOGEN is the only one currently in the house that was in the house last year too.
4. MOGEN was her best friend. She knew Xana KERNODLE very well and became close to Kaylee GONCALVES.
5. MOGEN facetimes her that night (12:40 AM Moscow time). MOGEN was at the Corner Club. The conversation was only about 40 seconds. MOGEN was with her friend, [REDACTED] (Phone [REDACTED]).
6. She communicated with MOGEN everyday.
7. MOGEN's boyfriend was [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. He was with [REDACTED] group of friends Saturday night at the bars in Boise.
8. She was told by [REDACTED] of a time at Winco when someone followed GONCALVES out of the building to her car. There was also another time when all the roommates of 1122 King Rd went out for a bit and when they came back, the back door was open after being previously locked.
9. She heard GONCALVES was walking her dog once and had seen someone hiding behind a garbage dumpster. GONCALVES felt someone had been watching her. This was about a month prior.
10. [REDACTED] had moved into the 1122 King Rd house this semester. Her boyfriend was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] lived in Boise.
11. She thought we should talk to [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
12. Last year, her friend [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was contacted by a man she didn't know who knew her name and major. [REDACTED] kept seeing this man. He once came up to her at the Corner Club. He knew MOGEN's major. [REDACTED] is still on the lease of the house. The guy was about their age.
13. The interview was concluded at 1:31 PM.

4. Madison Mogen was her best friend. Mogen, Xana Kernodle and her, were in the same sorority. Kaylee Goncalves was Mogen's childhood best friend. [REDACTED] said she never hung out with Ethan Chapin.
5. The last time she spoke to Mogen was a week prior to the incident, via text.
6. I asked [REDACTED] if Mogen ever mentioned anything about a stalker. [REDACTED] said "no".
7. [REDACTED] asked Mogen how the "house" was doing. Mogen said the house and the roommates were great. They had a good system in place.
8. [REDACTED] was Mogen's boyfriend. They had been dating for approximately two years. Their relationship was good, and they never had any arguments. She never observed any arguments between them.
9. Sgt. Hoxie asked what room she lived in when she stayed there for school. [REDACTED] said her room was upstairs on the left and Mogen's room was on the right.
10. Over the summer, she still had some belongings there because she planned on going back.
11. Towards the end of July, Goncalves texted [REDACTED] and asked if she could move into her room. [REDACTED] told her yes because she had decided to not go back to the house and stayed in Boise.
12. Goncalves worked from home remotely and was home most of the time. Goncalves had a roommate who was living with her for the summer, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
13. I asked if she knew all the tenants who currently resided in the house. [REDACTED] said along with the three involved, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] lived in Reno, NV.
14. [REDACTED] kept in contact with her regularly.
15. She met Mogen in 2019 and had been friends with her since. She said Mogen was the most anti-conflict person ever.
16. [REDACTED] told her, the Friday before the incident, the girls had a [REDACTED] sorority formal. The formal was kept "intimate". They only had people they knew at the formal and it did not get out of hand.
17. [REDACTED] described the house she lived in as an "open door policy", meaning people were constantly going in and out of the house. She was always scared of "something like that happening." She would triple check the lock on her bedroom door, because she didn't feel safe. Mogen would leave her bedroom door unlocked most of the time as well as her window. There were times she would hear footsteps in the house and would blow it off thinking someone just had a friend over.
18. Sgt. Hoxie asked while she was living there, if there were any break ins or if she heard of a stalker. There would be times she would wake up and would see the sliding glass door was unlocked. She thought it might have been from someone forgetting to lock the door after having people over the night before.
19. I asked about other times the glass door was found unlocked or opened. [REDACTED] told her a while back, they had all gone out. When they got back, they noticed the sliding glass door was open. The girls were usually pretty good at making sure the doors were locked. Most people would use the front door. Only their close friends would use the sliding glass door in the kitchen.
20. She had three different "run-ins" with a white male who, she described as approximately 5'5", fit build, slick back hair, clean shaved, possibly mid 20's. The first time was at the Corner Club. He approached her and called her by name. [REDACTED] did not know him. He told her he had come back and changed his major. A little while after that incident, during parents' weekend, [REDACTED] saw the same guy at a restaurant called Nectar. He was sitting at the bar with his back to her. As she was leaving, he turned and stared at her as she left. She told her boyfriend about the "weird guy" she kept seeing. The third time was walking down the street in town, the male was with a group of guys across the street. He turned and stared at her as she walked by. She told her boyfriend about "the guy". Her boyfriend was going to talk to "the guy", but she did not let him. She never figured out who the guy was but did remember what he looked like.

21. Sgt. Hoxie asked [REDACTED] if Goncalves ever talked about a stalker. [REDACTED] told her about a time at WinCo, where Goncalves thought somebody was following her. Recently, Goncalves told [REDACTED] she took out the trash to the dumpster located across the parking lot and felt there was a figure standing around close by. Goncalves texted her friend, [REDACTED], and asked her when she would be home. Goncalves was home alone at the time.

22. Sgt. Hoxie asked if she heard about how the girl's day had gone. She heard about the days activities from [REDACTED] and through Snap Chat. [REDACTED] said they had a really good day and had fun. It sounded like they started at their house and went to the [REDACTED] Apartments. She believed at some point, Kernodle and her boyfriend, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] went back to the house, because they weren't twenty-one years old. Mogen and Goncalves then went to the Corner Club.

23. [REDACTED] told her the last text he got from Mogen was, she just woke up from a nap and was going to the Corner Club.

24. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] had mentioned what she thought happened. It was game day, so everyone had been drinking. [REDACTED] told her she wasn't sure when Kernodle and Chapin got home. Kernodle was with [REDACTED], and they were home before Mogen and Goncalves got back. [REDACTED] told her she went upstairs and ate Grub Truck with Mogen and Goncalves. She went back downstairs to go to bed. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] mentioned seeing anybody else in the house or if anybody came home with Mogen and Goncalves. She said "no", it sounded like it was just the three of them eating Grub Truck.

25. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] she woke up around 4:00 A.M. to music playing. She hoped Goncalves would turn it off soon. [REDACTED] had said she could hear Goncalves and their dog, Murphy, play upstairs. Shortly after that, [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] the music turned off and heard Goncalves say "I think someone is here". [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] she heard someone run upstairs and run back down. [REDACTED] said she peeked out of her room and did not see anything but could vaguely hear someone in the bathroom. She called [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] told her to come down to her room. After a few minutes, [REDACTED] told her she opened her bedroom door and saw a person standing out there and they made eye contact. [REDACTED] said he then walked out the sliding glass door.

26. Sgt. Hoxie asked if [REDACTED] had described this person to her. [REDACTED] told her she felt hazy and didn't remember many details. [REDACTED] told her she thought the person was about her height and had his face and forehead covered. [REDACTED] said she ran to [REDACTED] room and locked the door.

27. Sgt. Hoxie asked why she thought someone would want to harm her friends. She thought it was someone who was watching. She was always afraid of that. She always had an uneasy, weird feeling at the house, which is one of the reasons why she didn't want to go back. She felt the house was easy to get into and easy to watch, because they didn't have any blinds over the windows and layout of the house. [REDACTED] had told [REDACTED] the sliding glass door was broken at one point. If the door was jiggled just right, the door would unlock. If the front door was locked, you had to enter the code on the keypad but if the deadbolt wasn't locked, the door could be opened.

28. I asked [REDACTED] if there was anybody else we should talk to. We should talk to [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

Narrative

1. On November 13, 2022, at about 12:22 p.m., MPD requested ISP District 2 Investigations to assist with multiple homicides at 1122 King Rd., Moscow, Latah County, Idaho. At about 12:34 p.m., ISP Sergeant (Sgt.) Darren Gilbertson advised me of the request. I was assigned as the ISP lead crime scene investigator.

2. At about 2:41 p.m., I arrived on the scene. Already on scene were MPD Cpt. Roger Lanier, MPD Sgt. Dustin Blaker, Det. Payne, and multiple other MPD officers providing scene security. Det. Blaker provided me with the following verbal briefing:

A. At about noon MPD was dispatched to an unconscious person inside the residence. When they arrived, two household occupants, identified as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] along with two other females and one male were outside the residence. The male, identified as [REDACTED] stated when he had entered the house he grabbed a knife from the kitchen and cleared the 1st and 2nd floors, and then placed the knife on a table inside the living room. When officers entered the house they found two deceased residents (KERNODLE and CHAPIN) inside a bedroom on the 2nd floor. The officers also found two more deceased residents (GONCALVES and MOGEN) in a bedroom on the 3rd floor. All the victims appeared to have multiple stab wounds. The sliding glass door located in the kitchen (2nd floor, rear of house) was open and there was a set of footprints in the melting snow leading into and away from the residence. There was one shoeprint near the western edge of the property leading west into a neighbor's yard. In front of the residence (north) were five vehicles belonging to the deceased residents.

B. Sometime in the early morning hours, [REDACTED] was awoken and opened her room door [REDACTED] and heard a male say "It's ok Kaylee, I'm here for you" and crying. She then shut her door. A short while later she opened her door again and saw someone approximately 5'10" tall, dressed all in black with a ski-mask standing in the kitchen. She made eye contact with the person and could see they were caucasian through the cut-outs for the eyes. She shut her door again and texted [REDACTED], whose bedroom is on the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told her to join her in her room and [REDACTED] ran down the stairs to [REDACTED] room where they fell asleep.

3. At about 5 p.m., after a search warrant was signed, Sgt. Blaker, Det. Payne, Latah County Prosecuting Attorney (LCPA) Bill Thompson, LCPA Ashley Jennings, and I entered the scene and conducted a walk-through. As we entered the front (north-facing) 1st-floor door I observed the following:

A. As you entered the residence from the front door there is a bathroom in front of you (south). There is a bedroom to the right (west). It appeared to be unlivd in. To the left (east) was a staircase to the 2nd floor and a small hallway. As you walk east down the hallway a small mechanical room was to the right (south). The hallway ended in a bedroom [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] bedroom had clothing on the floor and the bed was disheveled. Her dresser against the north wall had a broken door and a drawer was partially opened. There didn't appear to be

any blood inside the room.

B. As you go up the stairs to the second floor you enter a small living room area. There was a folding table set up on the west side of the area, partially blocking the entry to the west hallway. The table had multiple red solo cups on it in game formation (Beer Pong) along with a small steak knife. There were multiple areas of red liquid on the table that appeared to be blood. As I walked west from the living room there was a half wall to my right. I could see multiple drops and runs of red liquid along the entire half-wall. Across the half wall (north) I saw more red stains on the wall (above the 1st and 2nd-floor staircase). The stains and liquid were consistent with cast-off and appeared to be blood. Continuing west down the hallway there was a bathroom to the left (south) with the hallway ending at a bedroom. On the north wall of the hallway, near the bedroom door, there appeared to be a red-colored transfer mark at approximately my shoulder height.

C. From the living room, looking into the west bedroom I could see a female (KERNODLE) lying near the center of the room. Her legs and arms appeared to be covered in blood. As I entered the bedroom I saw multiple drops of red liquid near the entrance and multiple red-colored drips on the door above and below the doorknob. A male (CHAPIN) was laying in the bed partially covered by a blanket and comforter. His neck and chest were heavily covered in a red liquid. Multiple walls appeared to have red-colored cast-off and there were multiple areas on the floor with pools of red-colored liquid. All the red-colored liquids appeared to be blood. KERNODLE appeared to have multiple cuts to her hands, arms, and face. CHAPIN appeared to have a deep cut to the outer portion of his right knee and neck area. On a desk against the north wall of the bedroom was KERNODLE's University of Idaho (U of I) identification along with a rolled-up Two-Dollar bill and a [REDACTED] consistent with a [REDACTED].

D. Exiting the bedroom and walking east there wasn't anything visible of interest in the bathroom. Outside the bathroom door there appeared to be small drops of red liquid near the baseboard, a small smear of a red-colored liquid on the south wall, and a hair stuck to the wall.

E. South out of the living room was a small step down and a bedroom immediately to the left (east, [REDACTED] room). South was a staircase to the 3rd floor and a small storage area under the stairs. To the right (west) was the kitchen.

F. [REDACTED] room was messy with multiple items of clothing on the floor and a notebook in disarray on the floor near her desk along the north wall. Her bed was unmade and her U of I identification was on the floor near the south wall under her makeup desk. There was no apparent blood inside her room.

G. The storage closet was tidy with nothing of interest noted.

H. The kitchen counters were cluttered with dirty dishes, orange containers and a fast food bag from Jack in the Box labeled Xana near the sink. The sliding glass door was just over halfway opened. On the outside of the window on the south wall were two handprints and a possible faceprint on the glass. There were also red-colored drips on the north side cabinets near the sink and a red-colored liquid drop on the floor. The red-colored marks appeared to possibly be blood.

I. As I walked south up the stairs they switched back to the north. On the center-wall banister were red-colored liquid smears. They appeared to be blood smears. At the top of the stairs was a small hallway. Directly to the left (west) was a bedroom (GONCALVES). The bedroom was clean with the bed unmade and a black colored coat laying on the ground next to the bed on the left side (when looking from the foot of the bed). Partially behind the door, on the north wall was a wire dog kennel. There didn't appear to be any blood inside the room.

J. On the right side (east) of the hallway, it ended with a bathroom. To the south of the bathroom was a small bedroom (MOGEN's). There didn't appear to be anything of interest in the bathroom.

K. As I entered the bedroom there was a bed directly to the left (east). On the bed were GONCALVES and MOGEN. They were covered by a beige-colored comforter with a large pool of red liquid near the center of the comforter. Multiple walls and the ceiling had multiple areas of red-colored cast-off. MOGEN had multiple visible cuts on her face. GONCALVES had severe trauma to her face and visible cuts with a large amount of dried red-colored liquid on her face. There appeared to be aspirated blood coming from her mouth. Near MOGEN's left

hip was a tan-colored leather sheath partially covered by the comforter. On the door edge, I saw multiple red-colored transfer smears. The upper mark was at approximately my shoulder height. All the red-colored liquids in the room were consistent with blood.

4. At about 5:24 p.m., I assigned ISP Det. Jake Schwecke to start a pre-evidence processed video. I directed ISP Det. Gideon Roberts to start scene overview photographs. I directed ISP Det. Hugh Powell to complete a scene sketch. After the vehicles were videoed and photographed, I directed ISP Sgt. Darren Gilbertson to search them. 1. On November 17, 2022, I interviewed [REDACTED] by telephone (phone) regarding his purchase of a [REDACTED] from Goncalves on November 12, 2022. [REDACTED] provided the following information:
- A. He located the [REDACTED] on Facebook marketplace.
 - B. After corresponding with Goncalves via Facebook messenger and agreeing on the sale price of \$6,500.00, he met her in the Hayden, Idaho Wal-Mart parking lot around 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. on November 12, 2022.
 - C. Goncalves arrived in the [REDACTED], and her father arrived a short time later. After a test drive, he handed Goncalves the \$6,500.00 cash and completed the deal.
 - D. He heard Goncalves tell her father she was going to keep the money, as she got into a light-colored [REDACTED] that had arrived as they completed the deal. He was unable to see who was in the [REDACTED] or provide additional detail about the [REDACTED].

- On November 19, 2022, at approximately 1119 hours, I, Idaho State Police (ISP) Detective Brady Walker, called [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]/2002) at [REDACTED] from my ISP issued cell phone while at the Moscow Police Department. ISP Detective Andy Hodl was present. The intent was to set up a time for an interview, but I learned [REDACTED] was out of town. Detective Hodl started an audio recording shortly after [REDACTED] informed us she was out of the area, and I began the interview.
- [REDACTED] started at the University of Idaho (U of I) the year before and met Madison MOGEN and Xana KERNODLE through her sorority ([REDACTED]). She grew close with KERNODLE. She met Kaylee GONCALVES around the middle of August (2022). She met [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] through her [REDACTED] the year before and their relationship grew closer after the start of the school year August 2022.
- [REDACTED] visited 1122 King Road at least once every weekend and described it as a "party house". She would usually arrive at the house before other guests. The parties consisted of playing games and drinking. [REDACTED] described the parties as people mingling with each other and playing beer pong and being more relaxed than rowdy or rambunctious. There were only a few occasions where [REDACTED] would go there to simply watch a movie or do something other than party. The parties occurred about once a week on Friday or Saturday and were normally attended by twenty to thirty people.
- The parties were normally attended by the same twenty or thirty people. If a person showed up randomly to the party without being invited, they would not be allowed to stay. [REDACTED] had not been there when that had happened. She knew of a house close by where KERNODLE had lived the year before where athletes would show up at a party if they heard about it. However, they were not welcome and were asked to leave. [REDACTED] later texted me a picture of a map of the neighborhood and circled the residence where KERNODLE lived previously. That address for the house she pointed out was [REDACTED].
- [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was dating a male named [REDACTED] who lived in Boise, and thought they had dated for a couple of years. She had not met [REDACTED] and did not believe he had visited Moscow. [REDACTED] would usually visit [REDACTED] during school breaks. The only complaint [REDACTED] had about [REDACTED] was how much he played video games. [REDACTED] did not believe [REDACTED] had a relationship with another male during this time.
- [REDACTED] did not have a boyfriend at the time. She somewhat dated a male named [REDACTED] and they [REDACTED]

- at least once, but the relationship did not really develop.
7. Ethan CHAPIN stayed with KERNODLE almost every night. [REDACTED] did not see CHAPIN and KERNODLE on Saturday night (November 12th) but had seen them on Friday (November 11th) and described their relationship as good. She described CHAPIN as helpful to the other girls and said he seemed to fit in the house without any issues.
8. [REDACTED] had met MOGEN's boyfriend a couple times and had last seen him at Homecoming at the beginning of October. She didn't know MOGEN that well, and they did not have deep personal discussions.
9. [REDACTED] had not met GONCALVES' boyfriend. When [REDACTED] was at the house, GONCALVES was usually gone or upstairs in her room.
10. On the night of November 12th, [REDACTED] was at another house party with some other friends. [REDACTED] later sent me a picture of the location of the other house party which was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] listed the attendees of that party as [REDACTED] (female), [REDACTED] (male), [REDACTED] and eventually [REDACTED]. There were potentially other attendees, but she did not know everyone so she could not remember. All attendees were students. At this time, [REDACTED] thought CHAPIN and KERNODLE were still at the [REDACTED] party.
11. When [REDACTED] left [REDACTED], she and [REDACTED] got a ride from a sober freshman in a fraternity to 1122 King Road. She could not remember the make of his car.
12. [REDACTED] could not remember exact times that she left the party and went to 1122 King Road. She had taken videos and photographs that night, and said the time stamp from the last video at [REDACTED] was at 11:54 p.m. The time stamp from the first video at 1122 King Road was 12:43 a.m.
13. When [REDACTED] arrived with [REDACTED] at 1122 King Road, she went straight to the bathroom on the main floor. They entered through the front door with the keypad lock. Several other people have the front door code, and the sliding door on the main level had not been locked when she was there. She believed [REDACTED] got home right after she and [REDACTED] but knew they all arrived around the same time. She was not aware of anybody else being home and stayed on the main floor the entire time she was there.
14. After [REDACTED] went to the bathroom, they went to the kitchen where [REDACTED] made popcorn. [REDACTED] sat on the floor and played with Murph, GONCALVES' dog. She thought that [REDACTED] had let Murph out. After the popcorn was made, they went to the living room and started watching Vampire Diaries. They didn't have much conversation while watching the movie. [REDACTED] took several "selfies" and videos. After leaving, [REDACTED] walked back to her sorority house ([REDACTED]). The time stamp on the last photograph she took at 1122 King Road was 1:33 a.m., and the first time stamp from media at her sorority was 2:19 a.m. She estimated it took about fifteen minutes for her to walk home.
15. While [REDACTED] was at 1122 King Road, she was only aware of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] being present and did not see or know of anyone else being at the house. She left through the front door and did not see anything of note while walking home. After leaving 1122 King Road, she did not hear from [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] until after receiving the Vandal Alert the next day.
16. [REDACTED] could not think of anyone who would be capable or involved in this incident. She also could not remember any instance of one of the victims mentioning a stalker or anything of that nature.
17. [REDACTED] sent me several screenshots of social media contacts and contact cards for some of the people she mentioned. She also sent pictures and videos she took that night at [REDACTED] and 1122 King Road, as well as the previously mentioned map screenshots. The audio recording of the interview, as well as the photographs sent, were saved with this report, Supplement 62, and will be submitted to evidence at the Moscow Police Department.

On December 4, 2022, at approximately 1330 hours, I, Idaho State Police (ISP) Detective Brady Walker, along with ISP Detective Cody Herman, met with [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]/2002) for a follow-up interview. 2. [REDACTED] had previously sent me the videos and photographs she took with her cell phone on the night of 11/12/2022. She had been at a party at [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] and several other people before going to 1122 King Road. I had [REDACTED] show me the videos and photographs again so I could verify the timestamps and confirm when her last media at [REDACTED] and the first media at 1122 King Road was captured.
3. [REDACTED] estimated that when she and [REDACTED] arrived at 1122 King Road, on a scale of 1 to 10 with 10 being "passed-out drunk", they were both a "6 or 7". [REDACTED] thought she might have been more intoxicated than [REDACTED] was.
4. The first video [REDACTED] said was captured at 1122 King Road had a timestamp of 11/13/2022 at 0043 hours. She and [REDACTED] arrived together and nobody else was home. [REDACTED] said when she got to 1122 King Road, she went immediately to the bathroom on the second floor and used it. The video begins close-up of [REDACTED] using the rear-facing camera. [REDACTED] switches to the main camera and zooms in on a pile of clothes in the bathroom. There was a pair of Calvin Klein boxer briefs among them and [REDACTED] believed the clothing to be CHAPIN's.
5. The next video was 0048 hours and depicted [REDACTED] sitting on the floor of the kitchen petting Murph (GONCALVES' dog). [REDACTED] had previously told me that [REDACTED] had made popcorn before they watched a movie, and that she could not remember exactly when [REDACTED] arrived home. In this interview, [REDACTED] remembered that she and [REDACTED] were already on the couch watching Vampire Diaries when [REDACTED] arrived home.
6. [REDACTED] had several photographs and videos taken while she was watching Vampire Diaries in the living room with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At 0124, she took a selfie with [REDACTED]. At 0124, she then took a selfie with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At 0128, she took a selfie with [REDACTED]. These pictures appeared to be taken on the couch.
7. The last picture taken at 1122 King Road had a timestamp of 0133 hours. The picture was of [REDACTED] asleep under a blanket. [REDACTED] had been dozing off during the movie.
8. The first level of 1122 King Road had an unoccupied bedroom with a bed in it. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] offered the bed to [REDACTED] if she just wanted to stay the night there. [REDACTED] considered it but decided to go home. [REDACTED] had previously stayed in the spare bedroom and knew the bed was not very comfortable. [REDACTED] stated she didn't pass any of the other four roommates on her way home.
9. The first picture [REDACTED] had back at her sorority ([REDACTED]) was taken at 0219 hours. The picture was of a partial bagel on the floor. [REDACTED] estimated it takes about fifteen minutes for her to walk from 1122 King Road back to her sorority. She went immediately to her room on the third floor, got a bagel, prepared it, and ate part of it before she dropped it. [REDACTED] best guess was that she had left 1122 King Road at approximately 0200 hours.
10. The only drug use [REDACTED] could recall of the four victims was that CHAPIN and KERNODLE was occasionally [REDACTED].
11. We had received a tip that an incident had occurred during parent's weekend at University of Idaho in [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] travel trailer. After speaking with [REDACTED] we spoke to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] regarding it. They told us that a male named [REDACTED] (believed DOB of [REDACTED]/2002) had hit a student's mother in the head with a water bottle. [REDACTED] removed [REDACTED] from the trailer, dragged him across the parking lot, told him he was never welcome in the trailer again, and sent him away with a sober driver. In their opinion, he was extremely intoxicated, and that was the only contributing factor in the incident.

1. On Wednesday, November 30, 2022, I, Idaho State Police (ISP) Senior Detective Gary Tolleson, was assigned by ISP Detective Gideon Roberts to investigate the purchase of a 2015 Range Rover by Kaylee J. Goncalves (DOB [REDACTED]/2001) from the [REDACTED] in Spokane Valley, Washington.
2. Detective Roberts sent me an email with the following, "Kaylee Goncalves purchased a silver 2015 Range Rover from [REDACTED] in Spokane Valley on 11/10/2022, according to her father. We'd like to have the salesman (unknown) interviewed for the details of the sale i.e., cash or loan, who was with her, anything unusual."
3. I telephoned Washington State Patrol in Spokane, Washington and asked for a law enforcement (LE) contact with Washington State Department of Motor vehicles. I was given several telephone numbers. I made telephone contact with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who is a [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. She assisted me with registering into a DMV portal and then helped me add my request for the title history of the Range Rover.
4. I received the Range Rover title information, which showed the vehicle being owned by a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who lived in Spokane, Washington. The lien holder on the vehicle showed [REDACTED] [REDACTED] of Spokane, Washington. The previous owner to [REDACTED] showed as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] of Graham, Washington.
5. A release of interest in the vehicle was signed by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] on [REDACTED]/2022 to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Spokane Valley, Washington.
6. On December 8, 2022, I sent an email to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] asking for him help on the Range Rover Kaylee Goncalves purchased in Spokane Valley. It was apparent that there was either a mistake in who owned the vehicle or there was a delay while the vehicle was being transferred from the auto dealer to Kaylee Goncalves.
7. On December 12, 2022, I received an email for [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The Range Rover now showed purchased by Kaylee Goncalves on **11/10/2022** from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Spokane Valley @ ([REDACTED]); [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is listed on the sale documents representing [REDACTED] [REDACTED] of Spokane Valley. I telephoned [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and confirmed the purchase of the vehicle. (Copies of the Washington and Idaho DMV and title paperwork placed into evidence with Moscow Police Department by me.)
8. On Thursday, December 15, 2022, I drove to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in Spokane Valley, Washington. I spoke to the salesman who sold the Range Rover to Kaylee Goncalves, [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]/1994). [REDACTED] told me that Kaylee came to the car dealership twice to look at the Range Rover. The first time she showed up with her two grandmothers, the second time she came with her mother [REDACTED] and her grandmother [REDACTED] [REDACTED] told me he saw no drama or conflicts between Kaylee and her mother or grandmothers during the sale.
9. Kaylee bought the Range Rover for \$24,423. She put down \$6,500 cash and her [REDACTED] [REDACTED] put in \$1,000.00 on a credit card, a total of \$7,500 down payment. (A copy of the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] advertisement offering the vehicle for \$24,423 was placed into Moscow Police Department evidence by me.)
10. Sometime after Kaylee purchased the Range Rover, the "check engine light" came on. She called and texted [REDACTED] [REDACTED] to complain about this. He told her they would come get the car from her if the light did not go off. [REDACTED] explained to me that the light could come on for many reasons, but they were unable to figure this out.
11. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] forwarded me copies of the text messages between he and Kaylee about the car problem. (The text messages are also placed into Moscow Police Department evidence by me.)

12. After the murders, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and wanted to return the Rover. Later she contacted them and told them that her husband did not want to return the vehicle.

13. I also spoke with the finance manager, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], who confirmed the price of the vehicle as \$24,423. He also confirmed that Kaylee put down \$6,500 in cash and the grandmother put \$1,000 on a credit card. Kaylee put in her credit application that she made \$3,200 a month as an [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] and had been working for them for five months at that time.

14. According to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Kaylee was a first-time buyer, so her credit was good, she received the car loan without having to have a co-signer.

15. When [REDACTED] [REDACTED] contacted them about returning the car, the dealership put \$1,000 back into the [REDACTED] credit card. Then when they found out the family was keeping the car, they took \$1,000 back out.

16. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] saw nothing unusual during the sale. He told me he did try to sell Kaylee an extended warranty, but she declined. [REDACTED] said the vehicle has a three-month warranty by [REDACTED] after sale. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is now waiting for the Rover to be returned to the family. Then it can be brought into the dealership to work on the check engine light problem.

On December 3, 2022, I ISP Detective (Det.) Hugh Powell returned to the crime scene for further crime scene processing and evidence collection. All items collected for evidence were turned over to MPD.

Narrative

1. On December 3, 2022, at about 5:20 p.m., I returned to 1122 King Rd., Moscow, Latah County, Idaho along with ISP Det. Jake Schwecke, and Det. Ryan O'Harra for further processing.

2. The items of evidence were marked with numbered placards and I photographed the exhibits. The following evidence was recorded and/or collected:

A.Empty Keystone Light can located in the stairway between the 1st and 2nd floor.

B.Black Jansport backpack located on the living room floor along the north wall on the 2nd floor.

C.Empty Keystone Light can located on top of the vanity along the south wall on the 1st floor, east bedroom.

D.Opened full Keystone can located on top of the vanity along the south wall on the 1st floor, east bedroom.

3. At about 5:50 p.m., I locked the front door, notified the security guard of our status, and left the scene.

4. I transported the items collected to the MPD and turned the items over to MPD evidence technician Tim Smallridge.

5. I entered the scene photographs into evidence, located at the ISP District 2 office, and provided copies to the MPD.

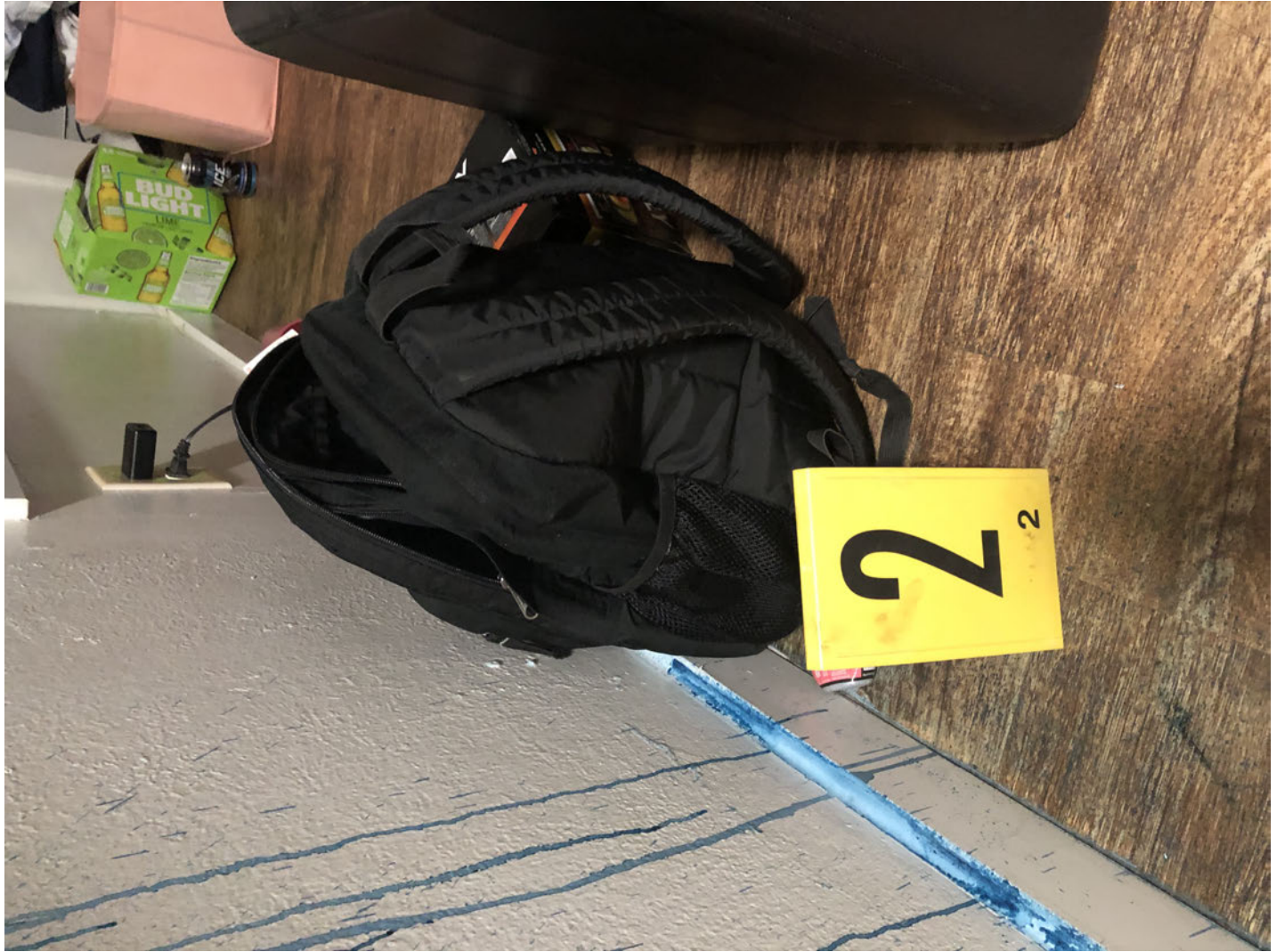

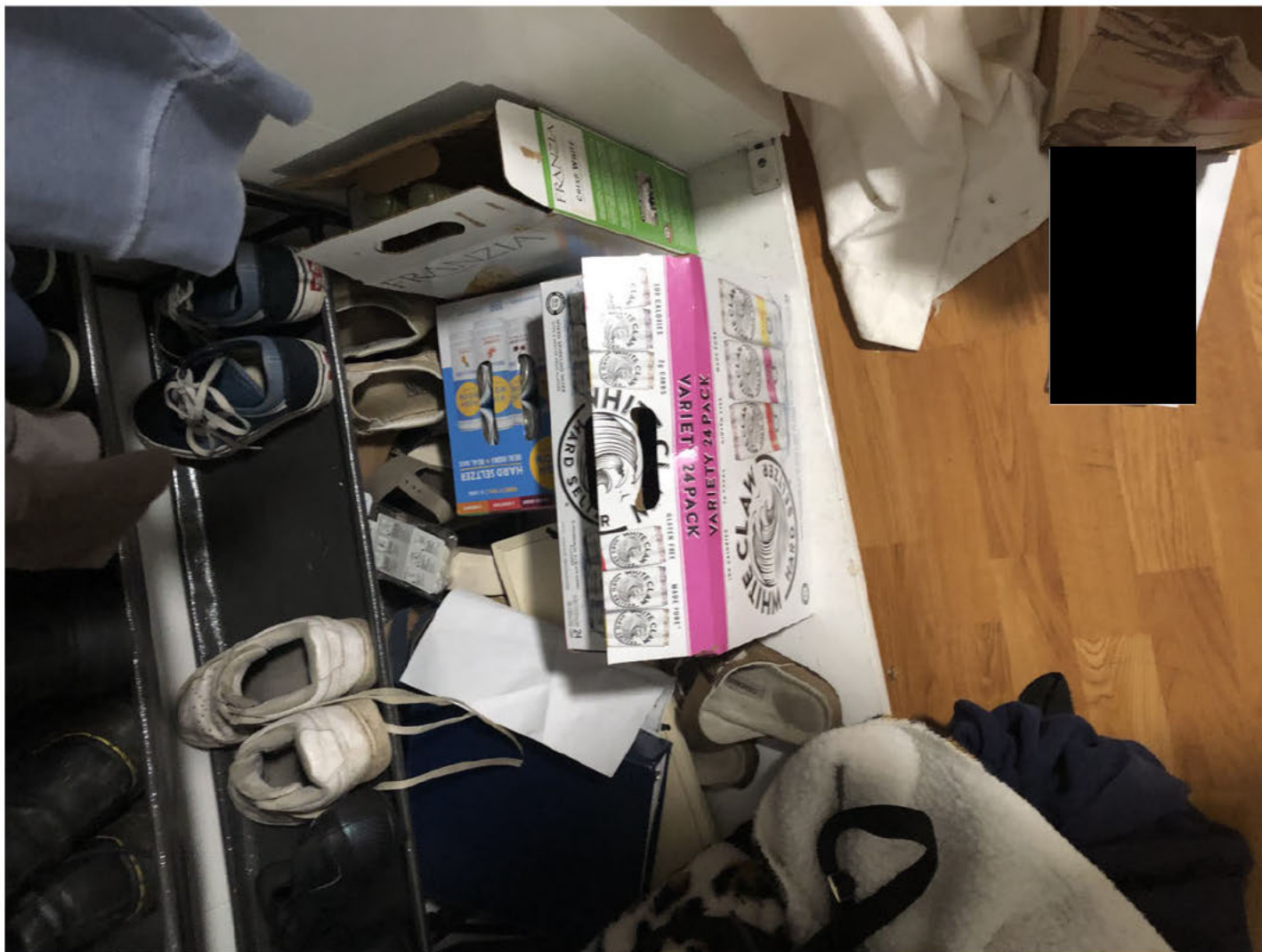

1. On December 30, 2022, at approximately 9:45 a.m., ISP Det. Tolleson and I met with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] attorney. During our meeting, [REDACTED] was provided the [REDACTED] for her review of questions to be asked of [REDACTED]. The arrest of suspect KOHBERGER was published by the national news media on the morning of this interview, both Det. Tolleson and I answered general questions and concerns from [REDACTED] before the interview with [REDACTED].
2. At approximately 10:15 a.m., Det. Tolleson and I met with [REDACTED] her mother, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was provided with the [REDACTED] and insight into our [REDACTED] interview. [REDACTED] agreed to complete the [REDACTED] and be interviewed about her [REDACTED] friends, [REDACTED].
3. [REDACTED] interview began at approximately 11:12 a.m., present were Det. Tolleson, [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and me. The following is a summary of the interview, listen to the audio for full details:

A. Before residing at [REDACTED], Moscow, Idaho, she had become friends with [REDACTED] through her sorority pledge class. Through the sorority and [REDACTED] she met and became friends with Madison Mogen (Mogen), who was [REDACTED]. During the spring of 2022, through Mogen, she met Kaylee Goncalves but didn't "really" get to know her since she was in a different sorority. In August 2022, she met Xana Kernodle (Kernodle) and Kernodle's boyfriend, Ethan Chapin (Chapin).

B. For the Fall 2022 semester, the five (██████████, ██████████, Mogen, Goncalves, and Kernodle) became ██████████ at the ██████████ residence and quickly became good friends. Chapin was a regular at the residence which helped them to feel safe within the house.

C. Goncalves was a very funny person, a prankster, very hardworking, and a person with positive energy. Goncalves had been in a long-term relationship with ██████████ but the two mutually separated, they shared the dog, Murphy. Goncalves may have been in a relationship with ██████████ ██████████ was Kernodle's ██████████

D. Mogen was very loving, a genuine person, social, and outgoing. Mogen could be "sassy", strong-minded, protective of the others, and could tell others to "back off" if they were inappropriate or unwanted. Mogen was in a good relationship with ██████████ but there was a kiss between Mogen and ██████████ while vacationing in Mexico.

E. Kernodle was very energetic, with positive energy, hardworking, nice, and genuine, she would tell "the absolute truth." Kernodle was "totally nice", but a fighter, and would address issues if needed. Kernodle was in a relationship with Chapin, and the two were very good together. Both Kernodle and Chapin were fun and the life of a party. Kernodle was close with Chapin's ██████████

F. Chapin was a social person, easygoing and easy to talk with, goofy, and likable. He and Kernodle were never far apart and had a great relationship. The ██████████ enjoyed having Chapin at the residence.

G. ██████████ is a lot like Mogen. She wasn't actively in a dating relationship but hung out with ██████████

H. Within the residence, Mogen and Goncalves were the "moms" of the group, Kernodle was the fun sibling, and she and ██████████ were the "young ones of the group" and enjoyed hanging out with the others.

I. All the roommates enjoyed partying at the residence, at Greek functions, and elsewhere. ██████████ was regularly consumed at the residence by the roommates and others, and ██████████ was used by some.

J. The roommates had common friends with ██████████, ██████████ and ██████████.

K. All the roommates used iPhones and social media applications for communication, mostly Snap Chat. ██████████ wasn't aware of anyone using social media or other platforms for money but recalled Mogen may have made some money from a swimsuit brand for sharing her swimsuit pictures.

L. Mogen and Kernodle worked at the ██████████ restaurant, Goncalves worked at home for a company, and Chapin, ██████████ and ██████████ were not employed.

M. ██████████ and her ██████████ would sometimes go to Pullman, WA for entertainment and food, but she couldn't recall going to the Washington State University (WSU) campus. She believed Kernodle had been to WSU to visit her ██████████

N. Before the murders, Goncalves had claimed to have seen a shadow (shadowy figure) watching her from the vegetated area behind the residence, which freaked her out. Goncalves had also told the roommates about a stalker at ██████████ in Moscow, ID.

O. When Mogen and Goncalves returned to the residence during the early morning hours on November 13, 2022, ██████████ and ██████████ joined the two in Goncalves's bedroom. The four were having fun and discussing their evening. Mogen repeatedly took Goncalves "Grub Truck" food, so they wanted to get more, but none of them could drive. ██████████ attempted to call ██████████ the Uber driver to see if he could grab more Grub Truck food, but ██████████ wasn't available.

Note: See ██████████ prior interviews for full details of the morning hours of November 13, 2022.

P. ██████████ doesn't know why her friends were murdered but speculated it could have been out of rejection or a hurt ego. She believes if Mogen or Goncalves were approached by an unwanted person, Mogen would have told him to "back off" or "go away". She also believes the suspect could have been a stalker.

Q. ██████████ claimed she and ██████████ were often "freaked out" at the house and she felt there was someone

outside her window (facing the backyard) periodically. She normally locks the doors but doesn't recall if she locked the doors on the morning of November 13, 2022.

R. ██████████ recalled the suspect having bushy eyebrows and wearing a mask. She couldn't recall telling ██████████ about the suspect having a big nose but stated she doesn't remember most details of her conversation with ██████████ after retreating to ██████████ bedroom.

4. Prior to our interview, ██████████ had learned the news about KOHBERGER's arrest and had seen his picture. In her ██████████, she stated, "From people releasing bryan kohbergers name I know it's him but I don't know". In her interview, she stated after looking at KOHBERGER's picture on the news, "Nothing came back to me at all, so that like, and...I feel like if I saw that my mind would be like oh ya that's him, but ...I just I don't remember at all."

5. ██████████ feels like there has been a "glass wall" between her and the things she saw and heard during the murders, ██████████. She can't understand why he didn't hurt her or ██████████ especially after she saw him inside the house.

6. ██████████ stated the murderer was in all black and carrying an object like a small vacuum. She thought he was wearing black boots. She doesn't recall why she thought he was carrying a mini vacuum and she had never seen the object (mini vacuum) before.

1. On January 26, 2023, ISP Det. Schwecke and I interviewed [REDACTED] at Washington State University in room 403 of the Lighty Services Building. The following is a summary of the interview, for full details review the audio recording.

- She has worked at WSU in the [REDACTED] since [REDACTED].
- Professors of WSU see graduate students three hours per week in class.
- She teaches graduate-level [REDACTED], and undergraduate-level [REDACTED].
- Her class, [REDACTED], was on Thursdays and she first had contact with KOHBERGER in that class on August 25, 2022.
- Nothing stood out to her in her first interaction with KOHBERGER other than him "wanting to dominate the conversation."
- The week immediately following the homicides, KOHBERGER was not in her class and sent an email

about not being there. [REDACTED] will be providing a copy of the email as part of the administrative subpoena.

G. The paper **KOHBERGER** wrote for her class was on burglary. [REDACTED] will be providing a copy of the paper as part of the administrative subpoena.

H. She covered for another professor for a Tuesday class the week immediately following the homicides and **KOHBERGER** was later than usual for that class.

I. She noticed a bandage on **KOHBERGER's** middle and ring fingers of his right hand. **KOHBERGER** told her it was from a silly accident that happened indoors. She didn't think it happened indoors because it looked like it had been scraped on asphalt. She believed she observed this injury prior to the homicides, but wasn't certain.

J. **KOHBERGER** wanted to dominate conversations he participated in.

K. **KOHBERGER** was systematically late to her classes. One time he arrived on time and she told him, "Hey, you're not late today.", and he laughed awkwardly.

L. **KOHBERGER** cornered her in the hall the first week of classes because she had not given him one hundred percent for participation that week.

M. She would deliberately not call on **KOHBERGER** towards the end of class because he always wanted to talk and would "go on these monologues". **KOHBERGER** would correct other students which she believed was inappropriate since that is her job.

N. **KOHBERGER** seemed to correct his behavior throughout the course of the semester and was more contained by the end of the semester.

O. **KOHBERGER** would present his opinions and ideas as statements of fact.

P. She heard from one of her students that **KOHBERGER** was telling other students that because she is a [REDACTED] he knows better.

Q. One day a female grad student came running into her office crying. [REDACTED] went and checked on her and the student said that she had just left class because of an interaction with **KOHBERGER**. **KOHBERGER** had said something very sexist and the student called him out for "mansplaining". **KOHBERGER** stood his ground and kept speaking in a way that made the student feel she needed to stand up and leave the room.

R. The following are examples of stories involving **KOHBERGER** that she had not witnessed, but had heard secondhand:

a. **KOHBERGER** told a female student that was "both disabled and gay" that he would need his partner to be physically perfect and a disability would not be acceptable.

b. **KOHBERGER** once told a [REDACTED] student something like, "Oh, I could never understand, like, what your experience is like as a [REDACTED] woman." [REDACTED] referred to this as a positive interaction between **KOHBERGER** and the [REDACTED] student. This was the only positive story she remembered being told of **KOHBERGER**.

S. **KOHBERGER's** research interests were very much aligned with [REDACTED] and as such, they had many conversations that she did not want to label "positive", rather it was more of what you would expect between a grad student and their professor.

T. **KOHBERGER** kept telling her he wanted to study emotions and decision-making.

U. **KOHBERGER** read a lot of her research and when he was required for another class to do a paper on another faculty member, he picked one of her papers.

V. She felt **KOHBERGER** wanted to work with her, but never formally asked.

W. She did not remember the details of the story but recalled **KOHBERGER** had said something homophobic.

X. She was asked by staff to check in on [REDACTED] because **KOBERGER** was harassing her.

Y. **KOBERGER** would go into an office where several female grad students worked and physically block the door. Once in a while, she would hear one of the female grad students say, "I really need to get out of here.", and she would intercede by going into the office allowing the female student to leave.

Z. **KOBERGER** really wanted to study burglars.

AA. **KOBERGER** had strong feelings that regular burglars had nothing to do with sexually motivated burglars.

BB. **KOBERGER** would show up anywhere from 10 minutes late, to an hour on one occasion. On that occasion, he brought a note from his professor. [REDACTED] will be providing a copy of the note as part of the administrative subpoena.

CC. All **KOBERGER's** graduate-level classes are in the afternoon from 2:00-5:00 and there is only one per day. He would not have had any classes previous to hers unless he was acting in a Teacher's Assistant (TA) capacity.

DD. She checked with the professor **KOBERGER** was a TA for and he told her he had advised **KOBERGER** to leave his class early so he could be on time for her class. **KOBERGER** continued to arrive late.

EE. **KOBERGER** had three courses as part of his Ph.D., two with female professors and one with a male professor. Students in the same classes began taking a poll of when he was late to female-led classes versus the male-led class. He was systematically late to both female-led classes and not late once to the male-led class.

FF. **KOBERGER** was obsessed with serial killers and would talk about it a lot in class.

GG. The week **KOBERGER** was not in class, three female grad students approached her and said, "Oh my God, class was so much better today, like, just easier to navigate."

HH. The classroom was set up in a circle around a table and **KOBERGER** would sit next to her every time.

II. She and her colleagues had a faculty meeting right before the Christmas break in which they discussed each of their students. **KOBERGER** took up the most time in this meeting because he was highly problematic.

JJ. She told her colleagues, "He is smart enough that in four years we will have to give him a Ph.D." and "Mark my word, I work with predators, if we give him a Ph.D. that's the guy that in that many years when he is a professor, we will hear is harassing, stalking, and sexually abusing of his, I thought would be his, you know, his students at wherever university he ended."

KK. Because there was a performance issue in terms of his TA duties, she and a couple of other faculty members made the recommendation to cut his funding and get him out of the program.

LL. She felt he was stalking people.

MM. She would not share his dissertation as a backup solution for kicking him out.

NN. The room was divided on whether **KOBERGER's** funding should be pulled or not.

OO. During her time at WSU, the discussion of cutting someone's funding to remove them from the program has never happened before. She knew of one student that had their funding pulled simply because they stopped showing up for classes.

PP. She saw **KOBERGER** in the parking lot of Safeway late the night before the Christmas potluck. He was so lost in thought she waved at him for "literally two minutes" before she thought, "Okay, I don't think it's him". At some point, he saw her and the next day he came and apologized to her.

QQ. A female graduate student came to her sometime during September or October and reported that

someone had broken into their apartment and stolen intimate items such as perfume and underwear and that she was very scared.

On December 4, 2022, I, Idaho State Police (ISP) Detective (Det.) Joe Lake met with [REDACTED], [REDACTED] of murder victim Xana Kernodle (X. Kernodle). [REDACTED] agreed to complete the Victim Background Questionnaire (VBQ) and be interviewed. [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] to both [REDACTED], X. Kernodle, and [REDACTED] who is a Washington State University [REDACTED]. He telephoned [REDACTED] about three times per week, regularly visited them, and would fly them to his home in Arizona at every opportunity he could. X. Kernodle was in a relationship with fellow murder victim Ethan Chapin, he felt they had a great relationship. X. Kernodle was good friends with [REDACTED] and the two were roommates the prior year. X. Kernodle recently dropped out of her sorority because of the \$1,000 fee. [REDACTED] helped X. Kernodle financially, he bought her a vehicle and paid insurance. [REDACTED] also fixed the broken hinges on the front door of 1122 King Road, Moscow, Latah County, Idaho residence where X. Kernodle lived, and the murders occurred. [REDACTED], a [REDACTED] stated the front was barely hanging on the hinges, so he used longer screws to secure the hinges, he recalled the door had an operable spring hinge. X. Kernodle wasn't scared of anything, she was a capable person, and a state-champion gymnast. She wasn't the type to lead someone on, and she would handle advances with class. [REDACTED] doesn't know why, how, or who killed [REDACTED], Ethan Chapin, Kaylee Goncalves, or Madison Mogen, but believes the person deserves the death penalty.

Narrative

1. I, Detective Sergeant Van Leuven, interviewed [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]/2000) on several occasions beginning on November 15, 2022. This supplement adds the audio from those interviews into evidence.
2. I interviewed [REDACTED] at the Idaho State Police District One office on November 15, 2022. [REDACTED] was the ex-boyfriend of victim Kaylee J. Goncalves (DOB [REDACTED]/2001). [REDACTED] had been dating Kaylee since they were in high school and dated on and off for approximately 5 years. [REDACTED] said that they had broken up approximately 3 months earlier due to her taking a job in Austin and that it had been a mutual decision with no drama.
3. [REDACTED] advised that he was driving a [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. He said that this vehicle was owned by Kaylee's parents, and they were allowing him to drive the vehicle.
4. [REDACTED] advised that he lived at [REDACTED] in Moscow with a number of roommates. [REDACTED] listed his roommates as [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I noted that the location of [REDACTED] apartment and the crime scene were near each other. I noted that [REDACTED] and his roommates were all members of [REDACTED] fraternity.
5. I asked [REDACTED] to describe his whereabouts and events leading up to the time that the homicides occurred. On Saturday, November 12, [REDACTED] advised that he was at work at the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] between 2:30 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. working mostly in the kitchen. [REDACTED] drove home to the duplex and went upstairs where he found roommates [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Also present was a friend who was not a roommate named [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] went downstairs changed into a sweatshirt, got a beer, and waited for a

- sober driver, who was a [REDACTED] freshman, to come pick them up. [REDACTED] said that the sober driver arrived in what he thought was a black Nissan Xterra and took him, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to the Corner Club.
6. [REDACTED] said they arrived at the Corner Club around 11:00 p.m. He said the club was packed and that they were admitted in because his roommate [REDACTED] was working at the club and let them in. [REDACTED] said he got into a confrontation with the [REDACTED] member named [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] had been messing with one of his friends. [REDACTED] friend, [REDACTED] who was there, told [REDACTED] to layoff and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] bought each other a shot.
7. [REDACTED] said he saw Kaylee at the club that night. It was not uncommon for Kaylee to be at the club. [REDACTED] said that he thought Kaylee was accompanied by [REDACTED] who was [REDACTED] girlfriend. [REDACTED] said he left at approximately 1:00 a.m. [REDACTED] said he, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were picked up from the club by [REDACTED] who was president of the [REDACTED] fraternity, and returned to their apartment. [REDACTED] said he had consumed 2 beers, 2 shots of tequila, one shot of Rumble Minze, and a 32-ounce tub of beer. [REDACTED] said after returning to the apartment he hung out with his roommates for a period of time, tried to throw up but couldn't and went to bed.
8. [REDACTED] said he woke around 11:30 a.m. the next day, Sunday, November 13, 2022. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] came into the apartment and talked about cops being down the street near [REDACTED] house. He tried to call Kaylee on the phone but no answer. [REDACTED] said he walked down the street where Kaylee's apartment was and saw [REDACTED] who was Ethan Chapin's [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said he asked one of the officers on scene to tell him what was going on and told an officer that his ex-girlfriend lived in the house. [REDACTED] said the police put him in the back of a patrol car for about 45 minutes. Also present sitting with [REDACTED] was another [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was a good friend of Kaylee's. At some point the University of Idaho put out a text, university wide, announcing a homicide had occurred.
9. At my request, [REDACTED] drew a sketch of Kaylee's apartment and labeled the rooms by the names of the persons he knew to be living in each room. I have attached these drawings to this supplement and will transfer them to the Moscow Police Department. I will also scan these sketches and place the scans on a disc to include the audio recordings of [REDACTED] interviews as well as other documents.
10. I asked [REDACTED] if he had any idea who could have been responsible for committing these homicides. [REDACTED] advised that he had seen a video from the Grub Truck on Main Street the night before showing a [REDACTED] member named [REDACTED] seeming to follow Kaylee and Maddie Mogen from the area of the Grub Truck before they went home. [REDACTED] also advised that he had heard from [REDACTED] that a man named [REDACTED] has been acting predatory at the Corner Club the night before and that the Corner Club had kicked him out.
11. I asked [REDACTED] to describe what vehicles the four victims drove. [REDACTED] advised Maddie Mogen drove a white Chevy Cruze, Kaylee drove a silver Range Rover, Ethan drove a red Jeep Wrangler and Xana Kernodle drove a blue Honda Civic.
12. We took a break and [REDACTED] left the room to speak to his mother who was concerned about [REDACTED]. Upon returning from speaking with his mother [REDACTED] said he did not want to continue the interview without a lawyer being present. We stopped the interview and [REDACTED] left.
13. [REDACTED] returned on November 17 accompanied by his attorney, Jed Nixon. After a brief recap of what we had discussed on November 15th, we resumed talking with [REDACTED] about his recollections of what had happened on the night the homicides occurred. [REDACTED] said that he, [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] got back to their apartment a little after 1:00 a.m. He said his bedroom was on the main floor. He said he hung out with his friends for 10 to 15 minutes. [REDACTED] advised he was drunk. I asked him to estimate on a scale of 1 out of 10 how drunk he was. [REDACTED] said he would put his level of intoxication at an 8 out of 10. [REDACTED] advised he had never experienced memory lapses, had never walked in his sleep and had never acted while asleep. [REDACTED] advised he went to bed at approximately 1:20 a.m. [REDACTED] said when he woke up the next day, he noticed that he had a number of missed calls from both Kaylee and Maddie. There was approximately 7 from Kaylee and 3 from Maddie. [REDACTED] said that he had had no argument with Kaylee the night before, and that there was no dispute, and no one was upset about

anything.

14. I noted in looking at phone records but there had been several text messages the night before between [REDACTED] and Kaylee. The last text message was from Kaylee to [REDACTED] at 2:15 a.m. telling him that she had his vape and that he could come pick it up at her house. I advised [REDACTED] that there appeared to be telephone call at 2:26 a.m. between [REDACTED] and Kaylee, that lasted approximately 17 minutes the night before. [REDACTED] said he did not recall the phone call and cannot explain it. [REDACTED] said maybe in his sleep he thought it was an alarm and he pushed the side button of the phone to turn the ringer off.

15. I have learned that [REDACTED] had been referred to the [REDACTED] because one of his professors was concerned about [REDACTED]. The [REDACTED] website states the mission of the [REDACTED] is to provide care and concern for students, faculty and staff who [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] said that he had been missing more classes than normal and that the breakup with Kaylee had been bothering him. He talked about her going to Texas and the fact that she initiated the breakup.

16. I asked [REDACTED] directly if he had committed these murders, he stated clearly that he did not. [REDACTED] consensually gave a DNA sample at my request. He also consensually gave his cell phone to be downloaded. I later took the DNA samples and transferred them to the custody of the Moscow Police Department. I took thumb drive containing the download from [REDACTED] phone and transferred that to the custody of the Moscow Police Department. [REDACTED] signed consent forms for both his DNA and for the download of his phone. I have scanned these forms and placed them on a disc which will be transmitted to the Moscow Police Department. I attached the original forms to this supplement.

17. The remainder of my conversation with [REDACTED] on November 17, 2022 involved victimology related questions. Please see the audio recording for more details.

18. I had a number of follow-up questions and interactions over the course of this investigation vital with [REDACTED] was cooperative and helpful throughout.

19. On November 18, 2022, [REDACTED] consented to a search of his room, bathrooms, common areas and downstairs laundry of his apartment in Moscow. Forensic scientist Kerry Hogan, Idaho State police Detective Jeff Talbot and I entered the apartment at 21:17 on the 18th. After searching the areas [REDACTED] had consented to, we found a drop of possible blood on a wall of the entryway. A sample of this was collected. We also noticed what could have been 5 or 6 small drops or runs of blood on a kitchen wall. Samples were also collected. This search and collection of possible bullet drop samples was documented through photographs by forensic scientist Hogan. We left the apartment at 20:20. Documents related to the consent, including the consent form and maps and pictures prepared by [REDACTED] are included on the disc. The original documents will be attached to this supplement and transferred to the Moscow Police Department. The search was also documented by video recording. These recordings were placed on a disc and will be transferred to the Moscow Police Department.

20. I had additional follow up questions with [REDACTED] on November 18, 2022, November 21, 2022, and November 22, 2022. The conversations on the 21st and 22nd were recorded and are on the disc.

21. [REDACTED] advised that he and Kaylee were co-owners of a mini Goldendoodle dog named Murphy who was 11 months old. Murphy had been in the house with Kaylee and the others on the night the murders had occurred. On January 4, 2023, I contacted [REDACTED] through his attorney Jed Nixon and asked him to bring Murphy to the Idaho State police office in Coeur d'Alene so I could take samples of Murphy's hair. [REDACTED] brought the dog in, and I clipped samples from 3 places: the top of the head, the mid back, and from the chest area. The samples were transmitted to the Moscow Police Department on January 5, 2023 by Detective Tolleson.

Narrative

1. On November 18, 2022, Idaho State Police Detective Gary Tolleson and I, Detective Sergeant Michael Van Leuven, interviewed [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]/1994) at the Moscow Police Department. [REDACTED] was the [REDACTED] that had dropped Kaylee J. Goncalves (DOB [REDACTED]/2001) and Maddie M. Mogen (DOB [REDACTED] 2001) off at their apartment prior to the homicides.
2. As [REDACTED] was one of the last people to see the victims prior to the homicides, he was a person of interest in the investigation. [REDACTED] cooperated fully and completely with our inquiries. [REDACTED] provided his telephone and consented to a search of the phone, as well as providing us with the password for the phone. The phone was downloaded during the interview and returned back to [REDACTED] before he left. The consent form for the phone was scanned and the scan placed on a disc to be given to the Moscow Police Department. The original signed consent form will be transferred to the Moscow Police Department.
3. [REDACTED] also consented to giving us a sample of his DNA. I took the samples using buccal swabs. I transferred these swabs to the Moscow Police Department.
4. [REDACTED] removed his shirt and allowed us to look for any injuries he might have on his arms or torso; no injuries were observed.
5. This interview was recorded with both audio as well as video recordings. These recordings have been placed on a disc and that disc will be transferred to the Moscow Police Department.
6. [REDACTED] advised that he was a driver for both [REDACTED] as well as [REDACTED]. He drove a [REDACTED] bearing Idaho license plate [REDACTED]. He said he's one of the only drivers in the area that serves Moscow.
7. We covered some biographical history regarding [REDACTED]
8. On Friday, November 11, 2022, [REDACTED] had worked until 3:00 a.m. He started driving again between 10:30 and 11:00 a.m. on the 12th. Beginning at 3:00 or 4:00 in the afternoon he had steady work until 3:00 or 4:00 in the morning. [REDACTED] advise his wife was not a fan of him staying out late driving, but that weekend she was out of town with her parents in Hayden, Idaho.
9. [REDACTED] advised that he had given Kaylee 10 to 15 rides since the last school year. [REDACTED] said he had also given Maddie rides but didn't know about Ethan and Xana. [REDACTED] said that around 10:00 p.m., Kaylee had texted asking for a ride to the Corner Club. [REDACTED] thought that there were 3 girls on that ride. [REDACTED] advised he drove them directly from the house where Kaylee lived to the club. He advised he had driven this route several times before. [REDACTED] said he doesn't remember what the conversation in the car was about on the way to the club. He said he has not heard or overheard any problems from the group of people that Kaylee is usually with. [REDACTED] said he tries his best not to be a creep. [REDACTED] said he got another text from Kaylee at 1:45 a.m. asking to be picked up at the Grub Truck. [REDACTED] said when he picked Kaylee and Maddie up at the Grub Truck, Kaylee sat in the front and Maddie sat in the back. [REDACTED] said he drove the two girls directly from the Grub Truck to their house. [REDACTED] said that Kaylee was a little more drunk than Maddie.
10. [REDACTED] said when he got to the house that the lights were on and that there were 4 cars parked in the driveway. He said he noticed a black SUV on the left side sticking out. He also said there was a silver car on the road. [REDACTED] did not notice anyone walking on the road. [REDACTED] watched the girls go into the house. [REDACTED] said on this occasion they didn't pay him for the ride. He said that was not unusual and that he expected that they would pay him later. [REDACTED] said he never gave rides for free and that there was always the understanding that they would pay. [REDACTED] said he has never been into the house or anyone's house as a driver. [REDACTED] advised that the girls state of inebriation was "pretty standard." [REDACTED] said that this ride was "off the books" meaning that it was not managed through [REDACTED]. The girls had his number and contacted him directly. [REDACTED] said that 5 to 10% of the rides he gives are "off the books."

11. [REDACTED] said he did not go back to the girls' residence that night. When asked to provide an alibi, [REDACTED] stated that he was home at the time of the homicides. [REDACTED] said he could support him being home at the time of the homicides by providing security camera footage from around his house showing his vehicles parked there and what time he got home. I asked him to provide a copy of this footage to the Moscow Police Department and he said he would. I was later advised that he had brought a copy of that footage into the Police Department and turned it over to them.

12. [REDACTED] said he first became aware of the homicides through the Vandal Alert text. [REDACTED] said he was shocked, that this kind of thing never happens in Moscow.

13. When asked if he had any idea who could have committed these crimes, [REDACTED] described an event that occurred approximately one month ago at the public restrooms downtown near Friendship Square. He said he stopped to use the bathroom at 1:30 to 2:30 a.m. and there was a thin-build, white male in his 30s with tattoos, approximately 5 feet 10 inches tall in the bathroom wearing a white tank top and sharpening a filet knife at the sink.

Summary Narrative

On November 21, 2022, I, Idaho State Police (ISP) Sergeant (Sgt.) Darren Gilbertson, conducted timed runs through the residence at 1122 King Road, Moscow, Idaho. Kaylee Goncalves (GONCALVES), Madison Mogen (MOGEN), Xana Kernodle (KERNODLE), and Ethan Chapin (CHAPIN) were murdered there during the early morning hours on November 13, 2022. Bryan C. Kohberger (**KOBERGER**) was subsequently arrested and charged with four counts of First-Degree Murder. The purpose of the timed runs was to gain an understanding of the approximate time needed to have carried out the murders.

I was assigned and worked as the lead investigator, for the Idaho State Police, in assisting the Moscow Police Department (MPD) with the multiple homicides.

Narrative

1. Based upon the processing of the crime scene and evidence collected, investigators believed **KOBERGER** drove to the area and parked at the back of the residence. There is a paved parking area directly to the south that overlooks the back of the residence. **KOBERGER** most likely entered the residence through a sliding glass door located on the second level and rear of the residence and then proceeded as follows:

A. After entering through the sliding glass door, **KOBERGER** walked through the kitchen area and to a set of stairs that led up to the third floor. **KOBERGER** then went up the stairs to the third floor. At the top of the stairs and directly to the left side is a door which was GONCALVES's bedroom and to the right is a short hallway that ended into a bathroom and another door to MOGEN's bedroom. Most likely **KOBERGER** checked GONCALVE's bedroom, saw it was empty, and then moved into MOGEN's bedroom where we believe both GONCALVES and MOGEN were asleep in MOGEN's bed. **KOBERGER** murdered both of them in the bed.

B. **KOBERGER** most likely went back down the stairs, walked through the second-floor living room, and then down the hallway which ended at KERNODLE's bedroom. Based on the evidence, KERNODLE was initially attacked just inside the bedroom near the entrance. KERNODLE fought the suspect in the bedroom area and was ultimately killed on the floor of the bedroom next to the bed. CHAPIN, who we believe was asleep, was murdered in the bed.

C. **KOBERGER** left the bedroom area, walked back down the hallway, passed through the living room, kitchen, and exited through the sliding glass door leaving the door partly open. **KOBERGER** then walked back to his vehicle and drove away from the area.

2. ISP Detective (Det.) Jeff Talbott and MPD Corporal (Cpl.) Brett Payne assisted with the timed runs. Cpl. Payne tracked the times for each run. Det. Talbott walked through the residence with me calling out the number of strikes to simulate the number of wounds to each victim, based on autopsy reports.

Narrative

3. I conducted two timed runs, the first being a quick as possible run and the second a slower, deliberate timed run.
4. During the first trial run, I began at the rear of the residence and came through the sliding glass door. I then quickly moved through the kitchen and up the stairs, I looked into the bedroom to the left and then moved down the hallway and into MOGEN's bedroom. I simulated the number of strikes that were inflicted upon MOGEN and GONCALVES. Det. Talbott counted and kept track in an attempt to re-create the movements and motions believed to have occurred based on the evidence collected and autopsy reports. I moved out of the bedroom, down the stairs, through the living room, down the hallway, and into KERNODLE's bedroom. Again, with the assistance of Det. Talbott, I simulated the number of strikes that were inflicted upon KERNODLE and CHAPIN. I then exited back down the hallway, through the living room, through the kitchen, and out the sliding glass door. Cpl. Payne reported a time of approximately one minute and thirty seconds (1:30) on the quick-as-possible timed run.
5. On the second run, slower and deliberate, I followed the same path throughout the residence but at a much slower methodical pace. I again entered through the rear sliding glass door, opening it slowly to make no noise while doing so. I then walked as quietly as I could through the kitchen and up the stairs attempting to make no noises. I looked into the first bedroom and then slowly moved down the hallway and into MOGEN's bedroom. Det. Talbott counted and kept track again as I re-created the movements and motions believed to have occurred inside the bedroom. I exited the bedroom, moved back down the stairs, through the living room, down the hallway, and into KERNODLE's bedroom. The movement to KERNODLE's bedroom was slower than the first run, but still somewhat quick. I again simulated the movements and motions that took place inside KERNODLE's bedroom. I then exited back down the hallway, through the living room, through the kitchen, and out the sliding glass door. Cpl. Payne reported a time of approximately two minutes and thirty-three seconds (2:33).
6. We additionally walked through simulated paths that **KOHBERGER** may have possibly taken from the vehicle to the back of the residence. The shortest and most direct path, going from the parking area, and moving east to west along the back of the house took approximately thirty (30) seconds. A second path, starting at the southern edge of the property and walking a fence line through some trees, and moving in a south-to-north direction towards the back of the house took approximately one minute (1:00). The times to make the same two paths at a running pace were approximately six to seven (6-7) seconds for the short path and ten to twelve (10-12) seconds for the longer path.
7. The timed runs revealed that it was possible for **KOHBERGER** to have carried out the murders in as few as two minutes and six seconds (2:06), going at a fast pace on the shortest route to the vehicle, or as much as three minutes and forty-five seconds (3:45), going at a slower pace on the longer route to the vehicle.
8. This concluded the simulated timed runs through the residence.
