3. Narrative

On 11-13-22, at approximately 1158 hours, I responded to a report of an unconscious person at 1122 King Rd. Dispatch advised a female was passed out from intoxication and not waking up. Dispatch advised there was a male seen in the room with the female last night. A short time later, dispatch advised the female was not conscious and not breathing.

As I arrived, Ofc. Nunes advised over the air it appeared to be a homicide. I saw a small group of females outside the home in the parking lot. One female advised their roommate was on the second floor and needed help. I went to Ofc. Nunes' location at the west bedroom on the second floor and passed a male in the living room later identified as H [REDACTED] J [REDACTED]. Ofc. Nunes advised the female and a male in the bedroom had blood on them and appeared to be beyond help. I walked out of the bedroom toward J [REDACTED] and saw a clean steak knife on a beer pong table. I pointed out the knife to Nunes. J [REDACTED] said he got the steak knife from the kitchen because he arrived and saw the female on the bedroom floor covered in blood and did not know if there was anyone else present in the room. J [REDACTED] said he checked the room with the knife for protection.

Ofc. Nunes and I walked to the first floor entrance with H [REDACTED]. I asked the females and H [REDACTED] if there was anyone else in the apartment and they did not know. I told Ofc. Nunes the home was not secure and we started the process of clearing it.

On the third floor in the south east bedroom I saw two clothed females laying on

a bed on their backs who appeared deceased. One female on the left side of the bed in relation to the bedroom door had an extreme amount of lacerations to her face and upper body which made her unrecognizable. The other female had multiple lacerations on her upper body and some blood on her face. I walked to the far side of the bed to determine if the female on the right was beyond help.

I saw the female's leg was off the edge of the bed and it had lividity. Once I noticed the lividity in the female's leg, I backed out of the room.

Ofc. Nunes and I checked the rest of the third floor and saw it was clear. There was a poodle in the west bedroom on the bed which was later taken to the Humane Society by LCSO.

After clearing the home, I briefly interviewed J [REDACTED]. J [REDACTED] said he was at his apartment, [REDACTED], and his girlfriend, E [REDACTED] A [REDACTED], received a phone call from one of the girls who lived at 1122 King Rd. J [REDACTED] said A [REDACTED] was called by one of the residents who said they could not wake the female on the floor. J [REDACTED] said he came over to the home at approximately 1155 hours. J [REDACTED] said he saw the female on the floor in the bedroom and did not see the male on the bed, who he identified as Ethan, before grabbing the knife. J [REDACTED] said he entered the bedroom and checked the female's pulse and found none. J [REDACTED] said he did not check Ethan and left the home. I thanked J [REDACTED] for talking with me and told him he could go stand with A [REDACTED], who was with the other residents in front of the home.

I stood by at the front door and started the crime scene log at 1215 hours. Sgt. Gunderson relieved me for approximately 3 minutes so I could get my gloves during my time at the front door. At approximately 1502 hours, I was relieved by Ofc. Rosinsky who took possession of the crime scene log and returned to the station.

At approximately 1528 hours, I came back to the scene and relieved Ofc. Smith, who was standing at the rear sliding glass door which was found open when officers arrived. I remained at the back door until I was relieved by Ofc. Nunes at approximately 1628 hours.
